



### Cluster Info

- SNFI cluster together with the CCCM cluster and the cluster members coordinated the response to the emergency of the rainstorm which affected camps in Idleb and coordinated with partners the NFI emergency kits distribution.
- SNFI cluster contributed to the Inter-Sector Assessment Questionnaire for the Rapid Needs Assessment for the Flooding Emergency.
- SNFI cluster updated the SNFI section of the Response Plan for the northwest of Syria.

- The IM Unit revised the 4W Reporting Tools based on feedback from WoS and OCHA and conducted a training on 2019 4W Reporting Tools. The updated 4Ws include GBV Indicators according to updates of the Results Framework for 2019.
- The Cluster Coordinator had bilateral Partner meetings to advice on Shelter Strategies.


