The Shelter and NFIs Cluster, led by UNHCR, coordinates the efforts of 143 total member organizations of which 51 are active. The Cluster addresses the coordination of emergency Shelter and NFI needs and promotes household and community resilience. The Cluster supports people in need within displaced, hosting and non-displaced populations by ensuring that the different modalities of interventions (in-kind, non-conditional/conditional cash or voucher) abide by the do-not-harm principle.

Highlights

Cluster Info

- SNFI cluster together with the CCCM cluster and the cluster members coordinated the response to the emergency of the rainstorm which affected camps in Idlib and coordinated with partners the NFI emergency kits distribution.
- SNFI cluster contributed to the Inter-Sector Assessment Questionnaire for the Rapid Needs Assessment for the Flooding Emergency.
- SNFI cluster updated the SNFI section of the Response Plan for the northwest of Syria.
- Part of the SNFI Team participated in a SNFI WoS workshop in Beirut in preparation of the HRP 2019 and agree on a common beneficiary counting methodology across WoS hubs.
- SNFI cluster shared with the cluster members the instructions document for the preparation for the HRP 2019 process.
- The January SNFI Cluster meeting was fully dedicated to the HRP 2019 preparation.
- The IM Unit revised the 4W Reporting Tools based on feedback from WoS and OCHA and conducted a training on 2019 4W Reporting Tools. The updated 4Ws include GBV Indicators according to updates of the Results Framework for 2019.
- The Cluster Coordinator had bilateral Partner meetings to advice on Shelter Strategies.

Winterization

- The SNFI Cluster continued to coordinate winter plans to prevent duplication and guarantee the filling of pending gaps.

Cluster Priorities

- Winterization: The cluster continues to coordinate winterization 2018/19.
- The Cluster responded to the Flooding Emergency which affected camps in Idleb and coordinated with partners the NFI emergency kits distribution.
- Finalize and share the SNFI Assessment Report from REACH.
- Support and guidance to the Cluster Members during the HRP 2019 process.
- Preparedness for possible emergencies in NW Syria.

Challenges/Gaps

- Limited Access in Northern Aleppo.
- Lack of enough cluster members with shelter rehabilitation experience.
