

Humanitarian Coordinators

Effective leadership and coordination in humanitarian emergencies

Humanitarian Financing

Adequate, flexible and timely financing

Partnership

Strong and equal partnership between UN and non-UN partners

Reasons for Clusters



- ✓ achieving more strategic responses
- ✓ improving effectiveness of humanitarian action
- ✓ allocating resources more efficiently
- ✓ knowing what to expect from each stakeholder,
- holding those responsible for humanitarian action
- ✓ providing predictability
- ✓ improving transparency
- ✓ provider of last resort





Provider of Last Resort????

Only if:

- Subject to access;
- Security; and
- Availability of funding (HC & ERC)






