Damage assessment:

- 499,508 homes destroyed
- 268,186 damaged homes.

Tarpaulins:

Shelter Cluster target 700,000 (350, 000 families)

Distributed

Government 230,569

Shelter cluster partners 217,259

Tents: 16,940

Tool kits and fixings 1,084


Household kits 43,921

Flash Appeal

- Flash Appeal extended until the end of September
- No overall budget increase
- Re-launch 29 May: Opportunity to for SC partners to revise/submit proposals
- Welcome new proposals, but keep in mind:
 - Not a guarantee of funding
 - Not all proposals can be approved
- Deadline for revisions/submissions:
 - 26 May 6pm (Kathmandu time)



Flash Appeal: Key requirements

- Organisations that are already operational
- Project can be completed by end Sept
- Links directly to the Shelter Cluster Strategy and technical guidelines:
 - Emergency / Self-recovery
 - Shelter, Capacity Building, Key messaging
- Clear targeting (hard to reach/vulnerable groups), gender marker
- Accountability to beneficiaries

- Thank you to all the agencies who have steps up to support with vehicles and enumerators




