REACH - Shelter Assessment

- HH data collection in accessible areas finished in all 14 districts by COB today
- 5 assessments in inaccessible valleys of 4 districts either completed (3 valleys) or ongoing (2 valleys)
- 8 district factsheets finalized, to be disseminated to all members by COB
- Preliminary findings presentation date TBD



District Coordination

Roving Hub and District support

- Support Cluster Core Business - coordinating agencies at District, VDC levels- Information management systems, technical guidance
- Recognise different ways of working - based on District and VDC level needs and challenges
- Gorkha is an example of working in different ways and need for flexibility supporting the district government and CDO plans.



District Coordination

Gorkha: some positive achievements

- Systemising IM 4WWW, Hub Coordination and Inter-cluster agencies, shelter cluster priority, WASH, Health.
- Support to focal points at district levels
- Development of 8 week operational plans for remaining emergency phase and temporary phase distributions in VDCs
- Development of distribution plans in Hard to Reach areas within the next 2-3 weeks
- Proving government with a clear picture of the gaps at VDC, Ward level
- Coordinating agencies, working together and complementing activities at VDC levels
