Still discussing over what should be done with the tents. Tents should be identified and should be destroyed if they are in really bad quality. Partners should follow the process for tents upon return: removing the tents, checking their state and storing them. Discussion to continue at the next meeting. 5. BRHA to send an email about the working group, intending to use BRIMS for the winterisation. BRIMS = System used by BRHA for registration, this system can help plan distribution and avoid distributions for IDPs both inside and outside camps. BRHA can also provide assistance on how to use this system. Next week: more information about this system will be given through a working group on BRIMS. Data TBC.

Especially regarding the cash component of winterisation which has changed. As the in-kind items change, the cash changes as well. (available on the website) 7. Guidelines were shared by Cluster. Mosul response camp populations	<p><u>Populations in camps:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 3,489 plots in camps currently available - Increase in plots available - With winter coming the movement of population could vary, depending on whether people are receiving food and other assistance outside of camps <p><u>Winterisation:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Assessment of needs and gaps developed at camp and governorate level - PiN: looks at in camps and out of camps with particular attention to people with vulnerabilities (critical shelters, female-headed households) <p><u>Gaps:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Sheikhan camp (916): has non-standard tents and many WASH issues reported 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Partners who have relevant projects please come forward so their projects can be included in order to calculate the gaps appropriately • Winterisation strategy and gaps should be shared next week by the cluster, including IDPs in and out of camps • Plan for Sheikhan camp movement to be confirmed and started (BRHA leading and CCCM/UNHCR supporting)

Waiting for an answer from the Turkish council. 	
Out of camps	<p>Emergency shelter for winter:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - UNCHR through Qandil who support distribution costs - The support is likely to be finished soon - Looking for partners to support this 	
Rehabilitation	<p><u>What has changed since last time is the amount of operations in different areas</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Increase in Bartella: 1,600-1,800, 1,200 already allocated - More clarification from UN Habitat - UNDP in Bartella - NRC in Bashiqa surrounding villages - CRS in Bashiqa, Bartella and Qaraqosh 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Partners to updated on their activities in these areas in rehabilitation
Arab returns	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Reaching the end of the response capacity, many NGOs are on the last of their stocks - First time UNHCR operated out of camps through Qandil - Much reduced capacity to respond now compared to 4 months ago - Tables with location and partners has been updated - More villages likely to be added to the list 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Partners to provide their stocks amounts - Weekly updates to be sent by partners from Zummar and Rabia (29 villages, 11-12 have people residing there at the moment)
Newly retaken and out of camp response in Pesh areas	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Several organisations looking at Sinjar and planning assessment/programmes there 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Partners who have new project in Sinjar to mention it to the cluster
