Review Actions from Last Meeting

Shelter Coordination Update

- a. Weather Situation:
 - Tropical Depression has led to flooding in certain regions.
 - SB Ovalau staff prepared
- b. Flash update (OCHA)
 - No approval on revisions from government as of yet.
 - \$1.1 million so far going to IOM
 - \$1 million from EU unallocated funds
- c. Code of Conduct for Humanitarian workers (Safety & Protection Cluster)
 - Influx of humanitaraisn, those affected vulnerable to coercion of payment or exploitation.
 - Message to those affected is all aid is free
 - Vulnerable groups in desperate situations trying to cope. We are responsible to all people to prevent abuse.



- d. GBV/Protection referrals (Saftey & Protecion Cluster)
 - Questions to address: What is potential for GBV? Where should people go?
 - Referral process available to responding agencies
 - HC is lead for protection
 - Can provide listening and support and right information
 - Not to be providing counselling only correct information about how to receive further help through referral process
 - Protection issues tend to be deprioritised when other needs present
 - FRCS is strong in Psychosocial aspects and could help provide training
 - Possibility for partnerships to address FRCS assessed gaps. FRCS may extend appeal to fund greater reach, find ways for potential partnerships to reach this goal...
 - Potential for Care to organize training
 - Upcoming vulnerability & beneficiary selection TWIG

IM Update

- Disaggregated data being cleaned and verified, once consolidated housing damage figures expected to increase.
- Current figures:
 - Completely Damaged (across all 4 Divisions) = 12,200
 - Partially Damaged (across all 4 divisions) = 20,065
- Gap Analysis provided to OCHA to provide visibility on response so far and highlight existing gaps.
- Indicators drafted last week to track progress agaisnt our shelter cluster 3 main objectives:
 - 1. Emergency Phase
 - 2. Supprt to Self-Recovery
 - 3. Technical Support
- Indicators divided into summary tables of agency outputs per Division or Province.
- Many assumptions made to come up with households reached.
- 'Emergency Shelter Awareness' table made up of agencies known to provide awareness component to distributions of emergency shelter (Care, Habitat for Humanitry, Fiji Red Cross, Shelterbox)
- Sitatuion Analysis & Summary Tables to be circulated after upcoming 3W update.
- Potential Gaps & Concerns:
 - Fiji Red Cross: Assessments find continued shelter gaps in RakiRaki, Tavua and Levuka, possibly requiring agency partnerships to help address needs.
 - ETM: Areas of concern have been highlighted with Western & Eastern Division
 Officers and agencies urged to coordinate accordingly with them to address
 Division-assessed remaining needs.
- 3Ws:
 - New form to be circulated that will help to fill Government Relief Tracker
 - Information to be filled to at least New Tikina level

Tech Update:

- From TWIG, establishing costing in line with the rough government figures.
