WFP Report, Shelter Section, from field visit last week:

Shelter

- Observations by the mission noted that most of the households were still not yet reconstructed, while some had some tarpaulins
- Some few tents from the Chinese government and Shelter box were also noted – but were not enough
- Discussions with the communities noted that shelter was number 1 priority- as most households had moved in with neighbors ever since the cyclone, and could still not manage to rebuild their households

■ Some households reported that they had been registered in the Help for Home initiative — but they were still to get the materials. However, due to the extent of the damage to most households, even the full \$7000 that the government was giving to the beneficiaries who lost the entire houses would also still not be enough to rebuild the houses — so beneficiaries still needed more assistance

Action to be taken

 Share the monitoring mission findings with Shelter cluster and other stakeholders for them to map a way forward.

Help for Homes Initiative

- Help for Homes
 - Discussed issues with Resident Coordinator, to refer to Attorney General and Ministry of Finance
 - Developed talking points:
 - More coordination and information sharing of card distribution, coverage areas, etc.
 - Need for post-distribution monitoring
 - Better coordination through Ministries and inclusion of relevant stakeholders, including Shelter Cluster
 - Humanitarian space for top-up, addressing gaps.
 - Logistics, transportation

NDMO - Lessons Learned

- Proposed topics to address for the Shelter Cluster:
- 1. Strengthen joint coordination (NGOs, Military, government, Humanitarian clusters) with common systems (baseline, monitoring, indicators, etc...)
- Enhance joint multi-sectoral needs assessment and response strategy to identify vulnerable groups, and recognize threats/risks to affected people, identify capacity for self recovery and support, community consultation and feedback mechanisms.
- 3. Agree on common standards on shelter items, response modalities and related awareness and technical support

NDMO - Lessons Learned

- Proposed topics to address for the Shelter Cluster:
- 4. Enhance **decentralised coordination**, away from Suva. At least to Divisional Level.
- 5. Unsolicited goods
- 6. Procurement, pipeline, consignment to NDMO
- 7. Pressure on technical support, national level
