The Cluster Team made a factsheet for July 2017. The Factsheet is available on the Shelter Cluster


website in <u>English</u>, <u>Ukrainian</u>, and <u>Russian</u>. It includes information on:



Agenda item 4. Update on Winterization preparation


Subnational Shelter/NFI Cluster coordinator mentioned that Shelter Cluster is working with partners and agencies to collect the data for Winterization coverage. The map represents three sectors of Winterization, which agencies were committed to implementing. Heating represents the largest sector of coverage for this upcoming year. On GCA area, agenciess had shifted to provision of wood or cash for heating as coal was reported as being of less quality. Green is demarcating Community Facilities and Infrastructure, and the blue marks are demarcating shelters Insulation. Senior Shelter Cluster Coordinator stressed the fact that the coverage of Winterization was only corresponding to cover 1/3 of the actual needs. Shelter Cluster has reached out to ECHO in order to make an advocacy session in the mobilization of support to cover the needs. Shelter Cluster would keep partners informed about the date of the event in order to solicit contributions from partners.




Agenda item 5. Damage database update

Shelter Cluster has drafted a map analyzing damages as reported from the 5W, Damage Database, and key informant interviews from the REACH Area Based Assessment. None of these databases is going to be exactly 100% which is why the Shelter Cluster Team has triangulated data from various partner

reporting. GIS Officer from REACH mentioned, that all the data was gathered by the key informants







interviewing, but for general data the Damage Database preferable. Shelter Cluster team explained that 5W only represented buildings repaired by humanitarian agencies, and that damage database was assessed by partner agencies and acts of destructions submitted by the Oblast, and REACH data would be overall figures encompassing new damages not yet repaired. The analysis of the average of the figures would illustrate where Shelter Cluster would have to prioritize assessments and to meet needs.

Agenda item 6. Subnational Cluster Updates

As mentioned earlier, at subnational level, partners had agreed on the need to make more advocacy to donors through the donors' forum. This advocacy would be done in collaboration with WASH and FSL Clusters.

In both Donetsk and Luhansk GCA, partners began to discuss revising the contents of the structural and reconstruction guidelines. The idea would be to have a technical working group at the end of November in Sloviansk to involve subnational practitioners. Subnational Shelter/NFI Cluster coordinator encouraged every organization to participate. In terms of the logistic amendment, UNHCR will try to set up with partners to invite them to Zaitseve and to do the meeting with municipalities and local government at the end of September. Cluster Coordinator invited partners to contact him as soon as possible to begin preparing the logistical elements of this cluster meeting in the field.

Shelter Cluster Team announced that a new version of the Donbass wall map was being finalized. If partners would like a printout version of the map, they could make the request to the Shelter Cluster Associate dmitrenk@unhcr.org.

Agenda item 7. Updates from Participants

PIN Shelter Coordinator announced that their organization could assist 190 households with coal distribution. They already have chosen Zelenopolye to cover about 90 households there. If partners have specific referrals for a gray zone or a contact line, or the needs of assistance they can get in touch with the agency. In case of receiving more money, than expected, Shelter Coordinator mentioned the agency's capacity to cover 200-300 households. with coal distribution Only locations with critical situations are the top priority. These are Mariinka, Krasnohorivka, Avdiivka, Mayorsk, and Zaitsevee(about 3000-4000 households in all locations).

GIZ is conducting a monitoring mission in Eastern Ukraine and waiting to publish a report in order to make a contribution to the Ministry of TOT strategy.

WFP announced that they were implementing one project by ADRA. The project held in Druzhkivka Collective Centre was successfully completed last month. WFP and ADRA were involved in the construction of a storage which is serving all 70 residents of the Collective Centre. WFP mentioned that the residents and management of the Centre received construction materials from ADRA, as that was one of the shortcomings of the project. WFP is also working with NRC on several initiatives including helping with water supply, construction of a pipeline, and reconstruction greenhouses etc. In Donetsk NGCA areas 50 000 IDPs were delivered food. As the winter months are coming, WFP also was looking to support relief efforts to improve access to food security. Shelter and NFI Clusters highlighted the joint effort that they had taken with the Food Security and Livelihoods Cluster to advocate for winterization programming in both sectors.



Agenda item 8. AOB

NRC asked about 4000 damages, mentioned in the Midterm Review, whether it is only on GCA or on NGCA too. Shelter Cluster Coordinator answered, that the damages included both sides of the contact line, so statistics include both areas. If required, agencies could request the Shelter Cluster to make an extract of any specific needs analysis of geographic locations.
