- During the NFI distribution exercise beneficiaries were lined up in three lines (for men, women and the third line for elderly and pregnant Mothers.
- The distribution went smoothly without any incident encountered.

What actors were involved in the decision-making regarding the distribution process?

During the distribution process, the RRC, Boma chiefs and Communities members were involved in controlling the crowd, cross checking beneficiary names and in the physical handing out of the NFIs to the beneficiaries.
