2	<p><b><u>Partner Updates</u></b></p> <p><b>NRC</b></p> <p>Project in partnership with UNHCR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Plans to rehabilitate 100 houses (50 in Tripoli and 50 in Benghazi). Vulnerability assessments ongoing to identify households</li> <li>- Initial technical assessments and to identify infrastructure projects in urban areas are done in consultation with UNHCR</li> </ul> <p>Other Projects</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Rehabilitation of 295 houses in Abu Salim ongoing. 70% completion rate</li> <li>- Vulnerability assessments conducted in Benghazi, Tripoli and Tawergha to identify households in need of shelter assistance</li> </ul> <p><b>UNHCR</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- 30,502 individuals supported as a part UNHCR’s winterization plan from Sep 2021 to March 2022 in the Eastern and Western regions. Assistance was provided to IDP’s in urban settings and IDP settlements as well as returnees.</li> </ul>		



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Winterization plan was suspended due to security/approvals issues in March/April. Once activities resume UNHCR will support an additional 3,925 individuals in Zawiya city</li><li>- The winterization kit was designed based on need and included Gloves, socks, boots, raincoats, blankets, mattresses, hygiene kits,</li></ul> <p><b>CESVI</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Continuation of Door to Door distribution in Misrata to ad-hoc vulnerable cases</li><li>- Distribution of hygiene kits to parents and caregivers within lice awareness session in Misrata Baity Center</li><li>- Changes in future distribution modality<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Discontinuation of door to door approach from April 2022</li><li>- Expansion of capacity to distribute NFIs in partnership with MoSA to Alwashka and Abu Grain from next quarter</li><li>- Planned activities</li></ul></li><li>- Kitchen sets and cleaning material distribution to 115 HH next week in Misrata</li></ul> <p><b>IOM</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- 4,039 Migrants supported with NFI's assistance during March.</li><li>- Kits included mattresses, winter blanket, winter clothing and hygiene kits.</li><li>- SAAD – 1644 men, 854 women, 825 boys and 716 girls.</li></ul> <p><b>DRC</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Distribution of shelter materials in Souq Al Ahaad to 51 HH's</li><li>- Assessments ongoing to identify 30-40 HH in Abu Salim to be supported with shelter repairs. DRC and NRC will coordinate closely works in Abu Salim to avoid duplication of assistance</li><li>- Plans to support 284 people with shelter rehabilitation in 2022</li><li>- Basic WASH services and small-scale infrastructure repairs and awareness raising planned under GFFO in 2022</li><li>- Plans to provide hygiene kits to 1,500 people in 2022.</li><li>- Fire incident in Sidi Sayeh last week affecting tow shelters. DRC provided with emergency NFI's</li></ul> <p><b>IRC</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Distribution of 66 Blankets and 192 refreshments at the Tripoli naval base</li><li>- 1009 individuals provided with NFI's at Ain Zara DC</li><li>- NFI provided to 653 migrants in urban areas in Tripoli.</li><li>- NFI's and Hygiene kits provided to 14 beneficiaries in Misrata</li><li>- 14 baby kits and 35 dignity kits in distributed 5 locations in Misrata</li><li>- 49 Dignity kits delivered under OFDA in Misrata</li><li>- Distribution of NFI's to 173 beneficiary in Tripoli under UNHCR</li></ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- NFI distributions included more than 18 18 items were different items are provided to different individuals based on needs</li><li>- PSS Kits to 44 children in urban areas in Tripoli including host communities and refugees</li></ul>		
3	<p><b><u>Presentation form REACH (Pathways to Reconstruction)</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Assessment is funded by ECHO and NRC and is mainly looking at pathways to reconstruction as well as main challenges and enabling factors for reconstruction</li><li>- The assessment focused at conflict affected communities in Benghazi, Tripoli, Derna and Tawergha</li><li>- Assessment was done in 3 phases scoping, recovery mechanisms and assisting recovery. And looked at reconstruction processes and mechanisms as well as coping strategies</li><li>- The assessment included affected households, key informants from municipalities, community representatives and construction professionals</li><li>- Assessment looked, challenges and difficulties, coping mechanism, support received, enabling factors and construction practices in each location</li><li>- Output framework for the assessment;<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• enabling and hindering factors</li><li>• coping mechanisms</li><li>• existing assistance and practices</li><li>• recommendations for suggested interventions</li></ul></li></ul>		
4	<p><b><u>Sector updates</u></b></p> <p><b>Shelter projects 9<sup>th</sup> edition coming up</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Very little was done around shelter in libya in previous editions</li><li>- The sector can lead the development of a piece for Libya.</li><li>- Partners with any ideas or interested to join this to contact Richard.</li></ul> <p><b>Eviction Task force</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- New eviction threats;<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Sport city in Benghazi – low risk</li><li>• Al Dawa Al Aslamiya – high risk potentially evicted first week of May</li><li>• Fellaah 1 and Fellaah 2 – Medium risk</li></ul></li><li>- Partners with response capacity or plans to reach out to the sector</li></ul> <p><b>Housing for refugees and migrants</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Sector is working with DTM to better understand needs, gaps, and existing practices to access accommodation and housing</li></ul>

If you have any resources, research, data or additional guidelines related to this please share with Richard</li></ul> <p><b>Strategic Work streams</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- SW1 – pathways to reconstruction assessment is ongoing</li><li>- SW2 – NFI – Cash vs in-kind modality – slow progress due to cash liquidity issues</li><li>- SW3 – settlements – informal mapping and coordination. Focus has temporarily shifted to evictions in light of the recent eviction threats</li></ul>
