Summary of Population Type / Numbers			
A. Total population resident in area <i>-Ref Census to County level</i>		According to IDPs head Chief for Nuer community residing in new Paloch school. On their arrival from Paloch town 1/1/2014 earlier this year the number was not known because they were not organized by NGOs or Government due to the speed of accident.

The IDPs are Nuer Community from eastern Counties of Upper Nile state who was affected by conflict in Paloch town, the current conflict which affected almost the all of greater Upper Nile region. It is not safe for them to leave the area now due to security reason.

List available?</i>		192 HHs 574 Individuals IDPs have been given some assistant by UN Agency particularly UNHCR, distributed NFIs in late May 2014. Blanket, Sleeping mat, Jerry cans and Mosquito nets ,but they were lacking cooking Utensil . There is no clear list from previous distribution that we could have relay on and that is the reason why we did this exercise to ensure the figure for IDPs.

Several assessments were carried out by different UN Agencies and NGOs to the IDPs site, but the findings also were not satisfactory because they were not shared properly. Hence WV conducted this assessment to get more information. These are conflict affected population who were displaced by conflict from town of Paloch and hosted by Melut County authority to stay at school temporary till situation normalize.

The IDPS are residing at schools given by Government of which the classrooms are not enough to accommodate all of them. About 6 structures of school permanent building that was used by County authority to settle the IDPs for a while. The school where IDPs are residing, is a little bit far from the other host community In the town of new Paloch.



IDPs women were showing up old cooking pots being shared by 2 to 3 families due to condition on accessing enough cooking utensil.
