# INSTRUCTIONS FOR BARI LEVEL SHELTER ASSESSMENT

## Objectives of the Assessment

1. Compare the government's damage assessment in the shelter sector at the ward level with the realities in the field.
2. Assess the levels of recovery in the shelter sector already visible in affected communities.
3. Determine the rough accuracy of government population information.
4. Determine the remaining need for emergency shelter.

## Sources of Information

1. Collection of official Ward-level government data from the Union Office, including: Totally, Partially and Not Damaged Houses in Cyclone Sidr, current population and number of families.
2. Conducting a Bari-level survey for all Baris existing in the selected Ward, which would rely on key interviews with senior members of each Bari and with a visual assessment of the shelter situation by the surveyor him/herself.

## Definitions of Key Terms Used in the Assessment

**Bari**  
A group of several inter-related families living in close proximity to one another.

**Family**  
Group of individuals living and eating together in a unit they consider a family. This can be most commonly defined by a group that cooks in one pot together.

**House**  
A building where families slept on a regular basis before the arrival of Cyclone Sidr.

**Uninhabited Building**  
Any building other than a house. For Example: schools, mosques, cattles sheds, separate kitchen buildings, clinics, shops, etc.

**Fully Damaged**  
A building that is severely structurally damaged and no longer habitable.

**Partially Damaged**  
A building that has at least 20 m<sup>2</sup> of safe and water-proof liveable space.

**Not Damaged**  
A building that has no damage that makes the house uninhabitable.

**Registered Land**  
Land to which the owner has a legal document to certify his right to occupy the land his house is on.
