SITUATION OVERVIEW

- **1.8 million** people live in over 1,400 unplanned IDP sites.
- **800,000 people** live in tents, 93% of which are more than 1 year old.
- **79%** of people in IDP sites live in critically overcrowded conditions.
- 1.2 million people live in IDP sites without lighting on main roads.
- 53% of household report having a member with a disability.
- 548,000 people accessed GBV services in 2021.

"...tents are too close to each other, no safety, no doors to close, poor lighting conditions. We have no electricity until now and going out at night in the darkness exposes us to violence."

RESPONSE

- 20 cluster members are currently implementing dignified shelter projects.
- 2,500 households in 15 IDP sites have been reached with dignified shelter from March 2022.
- **16,000 households in 45 IDP** sites are targeted through ongoing projects.
- 50% of dignified shelter projects are funded through the Syria Cross-Border Humanitarian Fund (SCHF).
- 45,000 households to be targeted in 2023 to cover all IDP sites with valid HLP.

KEY ACTIVITIES

- Replace tents with medium term, robust shelter with greater privacy, security & protection.
- Infrastructure improvement of IDP sites: including multi-sector site planning, drainage, sewage, sustainable water networks.

IMPLEMENTATION PHASES

- **Phases I-IV (2022-2023):** Most vulnerable sites, with old tens, subject to flooding. Has valid HLP.
- Phase V (2024): Vulnerable sites with pending or without valid HLP.
