The IDPS were affected by the conflict that broke out in December 2013 to March 2014. Since the civil war broke out within the State, most of the IDPs fled away from their homes due to political instability between

the SPLA and the SPLA in opposition. Due to insecurity in the State, the IDPs were forced to leave their homes and went to UNMISS compound in Malakal

There was an existing list provided by the community leaders. The team meets with community leaders of both Poc 1, 2 and 3 and agreed on verification/assessment methodology to be used. Verification was conducted by doing house to house visits and give out token.

As mentioned above, the teams recommended the distribution of plastic sheet as requested by chiefs and verified by the team. Each HH will be given 1 plastic sheet so the selected households will also be protected from sun and rain.

Key considerations for distribution

-Eg access, logistics, security and protection concerns, push/pull, stakeholders/partners to work with

The items will be transported from rub hall to the side using car.
Community leaders of both PoC1, 2 and 3 will be involved in the distribution process. The items will remain inside the car

	till the completion of the distribution. Security in both PoC 1,2 and3 is fine. Distribution will be started in PoC 1 followed by 2 and lastly 3 The following agencies will carry out the distribution, Medair, WVI, IOM, DRC and Intersos.
