Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) 2015 process	OCHA briefed partners on the HRP process including the HNO and Strategic Response Plan. The HNO review process will enable clusters to update the need in the country. OCHA informed Cluster partners about the agreed schedule of the Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) process.			
Emergency Responses to Sana'a, Amran and Al Jawf	 Sana'a City: RI: briefed about their project for Damaj IDPs and updated that most of the beneficiaries targeted by the project have already left the place of displacement. DRC: informed about an on-going assessment undertaken by DRC in Sana'a City which have started last week and will be completed after Eid occasion. The assessment is targeting 7 areas in Sana'a City. The initial assessment finding confirmed that IDPs have returned back to their homes after the signing of the peace agreement and emphasised that IDPs and affected population are unable to express their right of freedom of speech. The assessment team recognized the damages of houses where most of houses occupied/used by the armed groups have different level of damages. DRC have registered some cases injured during the conflict. informed the teams about the cancellation of the assessment as they were advised to			
not to go for the assessment at this stage. Today, The Emergency Taskforce (ETF)			
will meet to discuss the way forward.
