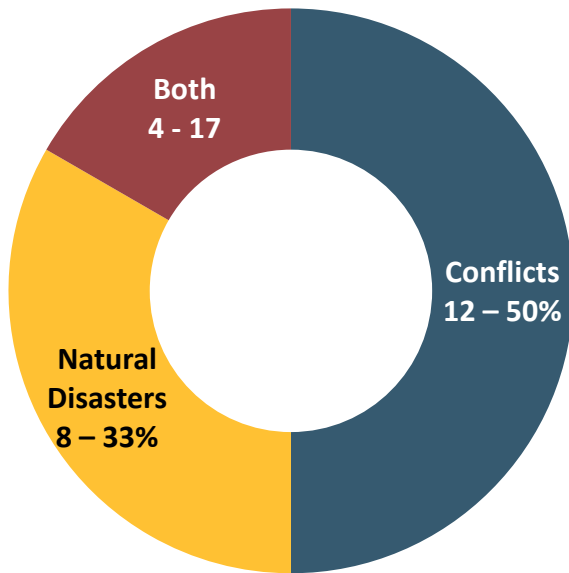
Since our last meeting...

- Philippines continues but not L3

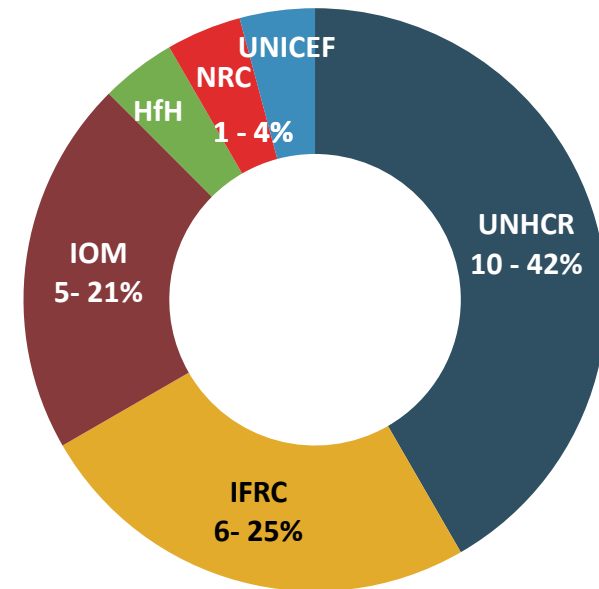

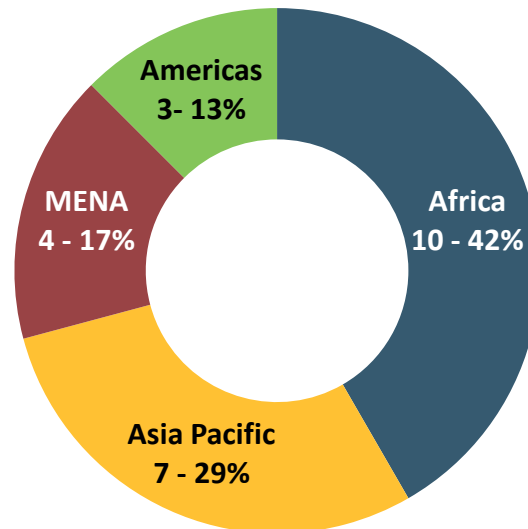
By type



By lead



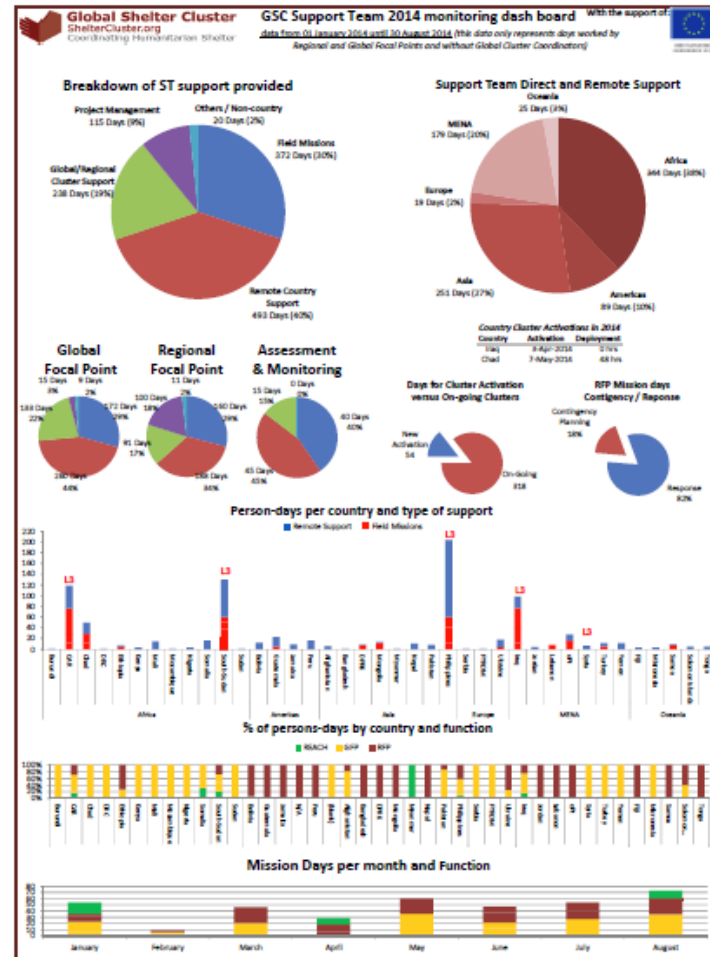

Strategic Aim 1: Responsive and flexible support to country-level shelter coordination mechanisms.

1.1	A harmonized surge capacity system for shelter coordination.
1.2	A diverse pool of available technical expertise .
1.3	A mechanism to leverage the capacities of the private sector .
1.4	Provision of technical advice for emergency preparedness and contingency planning .
1.5	A coordinated approach to shelter assessments .
1.6	A transparent and inclusive approach to facilitating access to pooled funds
1.7	Available capacity to provide learning support for ongoing shelter responses, by reviewing and defining success , and capturing and sharing innovation and good practice in the field through interagency impact evaluations, reviews , and other learning support options.
1.8	Increased capacity to engage in shelter early recovery activities and a consistent approach to cluster handover and exit strategies.
1.9	Increased engagement with and participation of local and national actors
1.10	A clear and consistent approach to shelter cluster coordination , readily available and kept up-to-date.

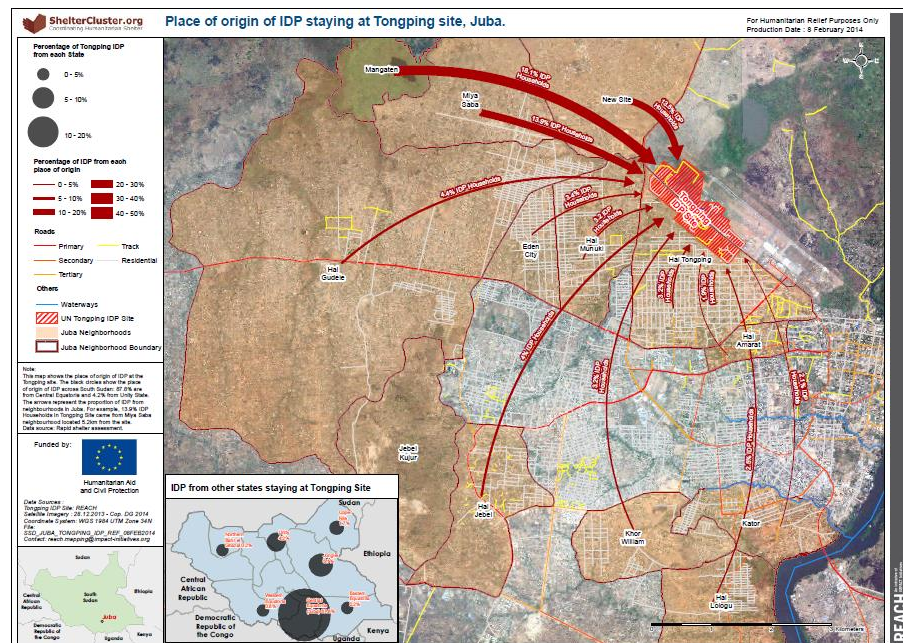
Regional Focal Points

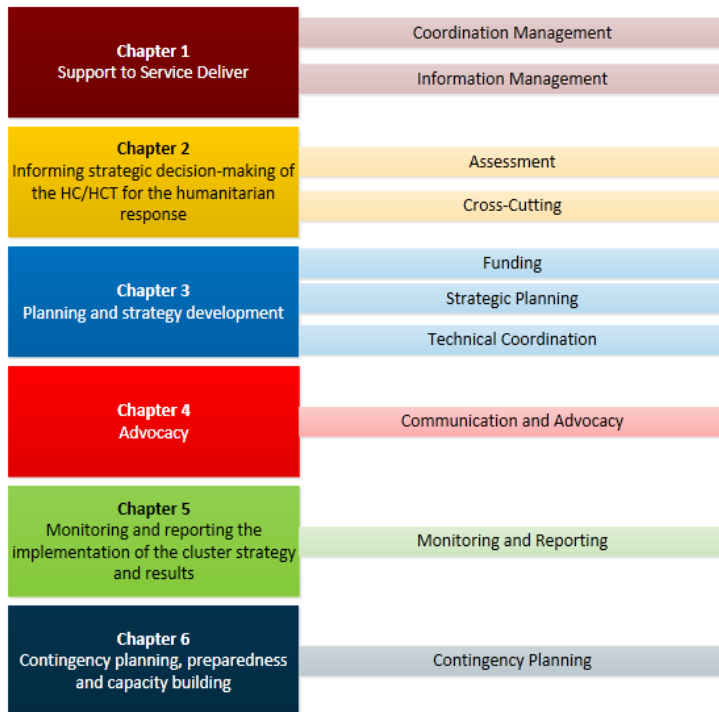
