Vulnerability assessments for HH level rehabilitations ongoing in Benghazi,
Tawergha and Tripoli. With plans to rehabilitate 128 houses in Benghazi, 78 in
Tripoli and 246 in Tawergha

#### **IRC**

- Reached 2,450 individuals with NFI's 11,000 items distributed
- Distributions in urban settings in Misrata ad Tripoli
- Distribution of NFI's in DC's for 913 individuals
- NFI's provided to 397 individuals at disembarkation points
- 36 PSS kits provided
- 57 individuals supported with NFI's through the CDC

#### CEFA

- Distribution in Al Zawiya in response to the appeal from the municipality supporting 81 families. provided HK, PPE and NFI's
- Next week distribution will start in Tripoli, HK and food items will be provided.

#### IOM

- NFI's to migrants in DC's and urban settings NFI's provided to 6,970 migrants in different locations. The items provided included summer kits, clothing and hygiene kits
- 1,990 migrants supported in DC's and 4,980 in Urban areas
- Activities covered urban areas and DC's in the east, west and south

## UNHCR

- Provided core relief items to families evicted from Al Fellah 1 and Fellah 2
- Distributions of CRI to families evicted from Al Dawa site is planned for next week
- NFI kits provided to 1,808 refugees and asylum seekers through Libaid and IRC
- NFI's provided to 817 POC's in Urban areas in Tripoli
- NFI's provided to 991 individuals at DC's (Tarki Matar, Tarik Seka, Gamfouda, Tubrug)
- Shelter projects implemented in partnership with NRC aim at rehabilitating 100 houses (50 in Bengahzi and 50 in Tripoli) and 2 infrastructure projects (1 in Benghazi and 1 in Tripoli)

#### REACH

- Some delays In assessments in the west due to approval and access restrictions
- 4 locations were covered with the reconstruction assessment (Tripoli, Tawergha, Benghazi and Derna)
- The assessment looked at construction practices, internal and external factors affecting ability to reconstruct as well as legal aspects affecting the process
- Analysis will be concluded in June 2022 and report presented in July

### Sector Update

- FTS figures for Jan-May 2022 presented
- Q1 achievements presented good progress made for IDP's, Refugees and Migrants populations. very small percentage of returnees and non-displaced populations reached

#### HRP updates

- 2022 HRP will include 6 projects for 5 partners with a total envelope of 10.1M USD

## Assistance requests

- Outstanding requests from last year
  - 1- Hrawa and Sirt (124HH's)- UNHCR provided 124 HH's with CRI
  - 2- Tragen (396 HH)- no updates
  - 3- Ghiriyan (700 HH) IOM is following up. Families are not displaced families or host community. Needs are mainly linked to chronic poverty and poor economic status. IOM's initial assessment concluded that NFi's will not be a relevant response
  - 4- Greater Tripoli (573HH) UNHCR is following up
  - 5- Zawiya (254HH) CEFA provided assistance to 81 families
  - 6- Zawiya (210HH) UNHCR is following up
- New assistance request coming from the Bengahzi social affairs was shared by OCHA- partners with capacity to respond/or who want to receive the request and haven't can coordinate with OCHA and the sector

Partners to share updates regarding response or share details around their response capacity

## Eviction Task force

- Al Dawa Al Islamiya site was evicted on March 30<sup>th</sup>. No reported use of force
- Some families affected have high needs and require immediate assistance
- UNHCR will provide CRI next Monday
- Other partners have the capacity to provide MPCA and MHPSS
