The term includes all aspects related to achieving the right to adequate housing with a humanitarian focus: emergency and longer term shelter support, housing construction and reconstruction, and settlement support such as site planning and urban planning. Shelter plays an essential role in reducing vulnerability and building communities' resilience. Shelter/C CCM/NFI	# of collective centers hosting IDPs that are in need of assistance	There are areas where existing buildings are used as temporary living accommodations, or so-called Collective Centres, for hosting displaced populations. The types of buildings used as Collective Centres vary widely. They include schools, hotels, community centres, hospitals, factories, religious buildings, police posts and even military barracks. It is important to recognize how the Collective Centres are managed is crucial to the quality of life, dignity and future sustainable solutions for residents and for ensuring that their life in the Centre constructively prepares them for life after displacement. However, if Collective Centres are properly selected, well maintained and well serviced, they can offer an adequate temporary solution.
