SITUATION OVERVIEW AND NEEDS ANALYSIS

Long, extremely cold and unpredictable winters in NW Syria cause acute suffering for 2 million people living without adequate shelter. Most people living in old tents in IDP sites without adequate sewage, drainage, electricity or water supply are children.

- **1.8 million** people live in over 1,400 unplanned IDP sites.
- **56%** of people living in IDP sites are children.
- 800,000 people live in old tents.
- 93% of tents are more than 1 year old.

RESPONSE

- Life-saving winter supplies include:
 - o Fuel
 - o Stoves
 - Clothes, blankets, mattresses
- 50% of winter response is delivered in cash.
- Out of the people reached with winterization last year, 70% lived in camps.
- SNFI Winterization Guidance Note
- Early planning & implementation is essential in line with <u>SNFI Better Programming Initiative</u>.
- Eco-friendly fuel types are encouraged.

GAPS / CHALLENGES

- Survival level of support only:
 - Children living in old tents will only have 6-8 hours of heat per day in winter.
 - Many households won't be reached due to lack of funds.
- Climate Change:
 - Longer-lasting winters (December-March).
 - Increased risk of flooding, snowstorms, extreme temperatures.
- UN Cross Border Resolution:
 - Expires in middle of winter & may jeopardize the response.
- Economic crisis reduces purchasing power:
 - Inter-connected cost of living crises in Türkiye and Syria.
 - Record-high inflation rates.

"I need to keep my 4 children warm enough to stay alive in the coldest months during winter. I usually strive to keep them warm while sitting close to a stove in the cold weather conditions." (Mona, a woman in an IDP site in Idleb).
