## KEY MESSAGES

The lack of warm clothing, insulation, heating heightens the risk of respiratory infections, hypothermia and preventable mortality among children and the elderly. Household Air Pollution (HAP) is particularly acute during the winter with over 28 per cent of IDPs using waste (paper, plastic, carton board, etc.), as their primary source of energy for heating. Women and children are at particular risk of exposure as they stay at home more than men. Similarly, a staggering 61 per cent of IDPs report possession of less than one blanket per member and 55 percent displaced households report having no winter clothes for all children.
