Update on Returnees and Response Capacity	Who	When
From Jan - 06 June 2017, a total of 32,177 refugee returnees (documented) were received in Afghanistan through the UNHCR Centers. About 98% of returnees were from Pakistan and 76% to Kabul, Nangarhar, Kunduz, Logar and Paktia Provinces in Afghanistan. UNHCR assisted all returnees with cash grant and other support. A total 1,888 undocumented Afghans returned or deported from Pakistan from 28 May - 03 June 2017. About 84 % of returnees from Pakistan (1,595 individuals) and 7% of returnees from Iran (416 individuals) assisted.		
925 families will be assessed (215 Kabul and 710 Nangarhar & Kunar province) and verified families assisted with tents, solar, tarpaulin, family tent and cash by IOM in the coming weeks.		
From 22 March - 31 May, IOM distributed 351,531 cash grants for transportation to 1,707 returned families from Pakistan		
Following the deactivation of the R&R Chapter, it was agreed that all sectoral response to returnees at the reception be reported through the clusters as of 01 July 2017. Only the cash grants provided by UNHCR and IOM will be reported under the R&R chapter in the HRP
