Shelter/Non-food items (NFI) Cluster Bulletin Issue 2 – September 2017

Monthly update

- Funding update - Of the 33.4 MUSD required for the shelter/NFI humanitarian response as set out in the Mid-Year Review of the Humanitarian Requirement Documents, 17.2 MUSD have been mobilized (51.5%), in addition to 1.8 MUSD carried over from 2016.
- A study on emergency shelter materials and construction in Dolo Bay, Somali region, was conducted under the aegis of the **Technical Shelter working group**, as part of efforts to evaluate the needs of the displaced population in terms of temporary housing solutions.
- The Shelter/NFI cash working group pursued its efforts to formalize a cluster approach for cash-based response, with the establishment of a community of good practices and the development of standardized tools & methods, in coordination with the multi-sector OCHA and FH led Cash working group.
- Flood task force – The cluster remains very engaged in the Flood Task Force to monitor the needs induced by the 2017 kiremt season and plan a response accordingly, notably in relation to the risk of overflow of the Awash river.
- Regional coordination The cluster coordination is being strengthened in several regions, including Somali where a humanitarian planning workshop was held on 21-22 September and the shelter/NFI response is scaling up, Oromia where several discussions have been engaged with regional authorities on improved information sharing, and Afar where a regional shelter/NFI cluster is being activated.
- **Oromia-Somali border conflict response** Following new clashes along the border in early September, the cluster has been mobilized to assess, monitor and meet the needs of the affected households in both regions simultaneously, based on limited resources available http://www.sheltercluster.org/sites/default/files/docs/advocacy_note-shelter_nficuster_conflict_response_september_2017.pdf.

Story from the field – Providing Emergency shelter/NFI life-saving assistance to the most vulnerable IDPs



Following the request from West Hararghe Zone and Gumbi Bordede Woreda Disaster Risk Management Commission (DRMC) to assist 11,700 individuals (including 2,475 women) or 2,310 households, who have been displaced by the clashes along the border between the Somali and Oromia regions and quick verifications, the International Rescue Committee (IRC) distributed 1,130 emergency shelter and non-food item (ES/NFI) kits and 1,065 dignity kits to the most vulnerable households in the ten kebeles of Gumbi Bordede woreda between the 28th of August and the 7th of September. This activity was conducted with the support and participation of zonal and woreda DRMC and benefited a total of 6,525 conflict-affected children under the age of five, pregnant and lactating women and women of reproductive age. Most of the beneficiaries and stakeholders appreciated IRC's swift and participatory life-saving inkind assistance, which was funded by OFDA/USAID.

Michael Tuke Ahmed, 30, a father of 4 (1 girl and 3 boys), resides in Funyaa Ajoo kebele, Gumbi Bordede woreda, West Hararghe Zone. Michael is a disabled person, who lost his home, 10 camels, 5 cows, 10 goats as well as his household utensils such as cooking pots, mats, bed sheets, washing basins and his stock of food (sorghum and 50kg of maize) during the clashes. Ahmed received a ES-NFIs kit from IRC. "It is in this situation that IRC has reached out to me and helped me and my family to find our way from death to life", he said. He expressed his gratitude to IRC for their relief assistance.

Asina Umer, 42, a mother of eight children from Buri Arba Kebele tragically lost her husband in the clashes. Her 10 camels and 14 cows were killed and she became homeless. Asina Umer is one of the beneficiaries who received a ES/NFI kit. "My entire family received a temporary shelter that protects us from the sun and wind storms. We also received blankets and other household utensils like cooking pot, plates and water containers. With IRC's support, I'm no longer worried about the painful sunshine, dust storm and vagaries of displacement", she stated.

Way forward

- △ Upcoming meetings: At the federal level, the next Shelter/NFI Cash working group meeting will be held on 17 October. The cluster will meet on 12 and 26 October. The next Shelter technical group WG meeting will be convened on 19 October. In the Somali region, regional cluster meetings will be held on 10 and 24 October, in Jijiga. The first Shelter/NFI meeting will be convened in Afar region in October (date to be confirmed).
- ☐ In October, IOM, with support from the cluster coordination and cluster members, will organize and deliver two Shelter/NFI trainings in the Somali region for regional & local authorities and humanitarian partners.
- ☐ The Global Shelter Cluster will hold its annual retreat in Switzerland on 2-6 October 2017 with the following agenda: 2-3 October Coordination Workshop for country-level shelter cluster coordinators to review the coordination tools & methodologies and share practices; 3 October Sphere consultations; 4-5 October Global Shelter Cluster meeting to review progress made and plan for next year; 6 October Shelter Centre meeting to share practices in shelter programming http://www.sheltercluster.org/resources/page/gsc-factsheets.
