A. SHELTER CLUSTER COORDINATION UPDATE	
SCNC provided updates on the key activities within the last month: • HPF 1 st allocation for this year was received, \$1m is allocated to the	
Shelter Cluster, SC shared the allocation paper with partners who	
have relevant HRP 2017 with criteria of upgrading and/or response	
to refugees from the region. Relevant partners should share their	
draft proposals with SC no later than COB 26 th April, deadline for	
upload to GMS by 30 th of April.	
 The REACH response evaluation report has been finalized after 	
various rounds of revision and discussions. It will be uploaded to the	
SC website and partners will be notified soon. A monkey survey will	
be shared with partners to get their feedback about the report.	
 The Gender assessment report was delayed since the consultant was 	
out of the country and the SC requested the consultant to include	
useful case studies. The report is under final revision and we expect	
the final version will be submitted within few weeks.	
 HRP Q1 report was shared with OCHA, the dashboard will be shared 	
following the HCT+ meeting on 1 st May.	
 A Technical Coordinator from the Global Shelter cluster is supporting 	
SC Palestine in several technical products including but not limited	
to: the shelter minimum standards, the contingency plan, and the	
reconstruction policy and guidelines. She will be with the Cluster for	
a few more weeks.	
 The SC field visit last month was successful, thanks to UNDP and 	
ACTED for their kind support and arrangements. It was noticed that	
many of the main agency representative who normally participate in	
the cluster meetings were absent and nominated others to attend

2- <u>UPGRADING OF SUBSTANDARD HOUSING UNITS - PRESENTATION - MERCY</u> CORPS

MC provided a presentation on the last HPF projects for upgrading of substandard housing units for PWD, and maintenance of metal Caravans last winter.

Summary of the projects and Lessons learned were shared, and two videos were presented. The links below are for the two videos

Main challenges:

- Outdated or inaccurate data received which required a lot of efforts to assess and verify the beneficiary lists.
- The project restricted criteria of targeting households with PWD, and the limited budget per house caused a drop of many vulnerable houses from the project.

Rachel Sider, Policy and Advocacy coordinator from NRC provided a presentation on a quick guide case studies to help as:
