Topic and Notes on Discussion	Action points	
1- WELCOME AND INTRODUCTION		
2- MOPWH PRESENTATION ON THE NEW RECONSTRUCTION POLICY		
Mohammed Alostaz provided a presentation about the differences		
between the new (revised) and the previous reconstruction and repair		
policy.		
The main changes are:		
Title: adding the inclusion of houses affected from natural disasters as well as conflicts.		
Damage assessment was mentioned in the new policy with operational guidelines added.		
Cash assistance: the values are not mentioned directly in the main		
document, but operational guidelines are included with details.		
Caravans are no longer accepted by the ministry as a temporary shelter.		
All paragraphs related to caravans were deleted.		
Self-help approach: was described in detail in the operational guidelines		
of the new policy.		
Contents of the document:		
1- General principles		
The main features include the right of affected people to be		
compensated for what they lose as a minimum, with a margin of		
building back better for inadequate housing (previously inhabited)		
units according to the family size and considering the needs of PWD's		
2- Damage Assessment		
Costing methodology will focus on the actual cost of repair		
/reconstruction at time of provision of assistance. Unit costs can be		
revised at time of conflict and modified according to market price.		
3- Reintegration and sheltering		
Detailed operational guidelines are included, and the reintegration		
considered different needs of the affected people such as shelter,		
food, furniture, other expenses, etc.		
4- Reconstruction and repair		
Only housing units that were inhabited before the conflict will be considered in the build back better approach. Others will be		
compensated with the actual value of the repair /reconstruction of		
what has been lost only.		
Houses with roofs of Asbestos or metal sheets will be reconstructed		
with foundation of Reinforced concrete ground beams, and the roof		
with foundation of Reinforcea concrete ground beams, and the fool		

will be 10-12 cm concrete solid slab, with moderate finish internally and externally.

Shelter Cluster commented on this last point that it was agreed earlier with the Ministry that such cases will still fall under the category of build back better according to the reconstruction guidelines of 2011.

Additionally SC is consolidating the comments on the policy document and will follow up with the Ministry before the policy is finalized, after which it will be shared with shelter partners.

3- TECHNICAL GUIDANCE UPDATE

4- SCC UPDATE AND FINAL OUTCOMES OF REACH ASSESSMENT

NSCC Fiona presented the main outcomes and recommendations of the 2nd phase of the Shelter Response Evaluation carried out in October - December 2016 and the report issued in January 2017.

There will a launch event of the evaluation reports to donors and diplomats in Jerusalem on Friday, the SC will describe the findings of the assessment and key recommendations.
