Current Situation

- Distribution of NPR 10,000 by NRCS to 7,000 HHs is in plan which will be started in the coming week.
- OXFAM has planned to distribute winter kit to 251 HHs. The distribution has been delayed due to various reasons.
- No completed or ongoing activities have been reported in Kathmandu District.

Background

Being the most urban city of Nepal, KTM has been least assisted despite the ease of access to distribution materials and facilities. In the initial emergency phase, the most widely distributed items were tarpaulins whereas CGI (the largest need) and Cash distributions were very limited.
