
- Average of 1-2 days for Shelter Repairs for organizations to agree to damage assessment (faster response time in warmer months)





UKRAINE: REFERRAL SYSTEM














Multistorey vs. private houses





Transitional Plan Walk Through

- Shelter Cluster works to promote additional capacity for response for durable shelter solutions for permanent stay of internally displaced persons and conflict affected populations through emergency assistance, transitional solutions, and the facilitation of longer-term durable shelter solutions until the minimum criteria for deactivation are met:
- "The humanitarian situation improves, significantly reducing humanitarian needs and therefore the associated response and coordination gaps.
- National structures acquire sufficient capacity to coordinate and meet residual humanitarian needs in line with humanitarian principles"


