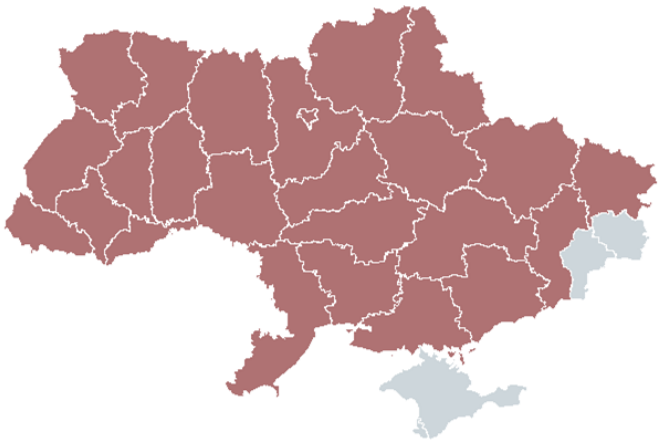

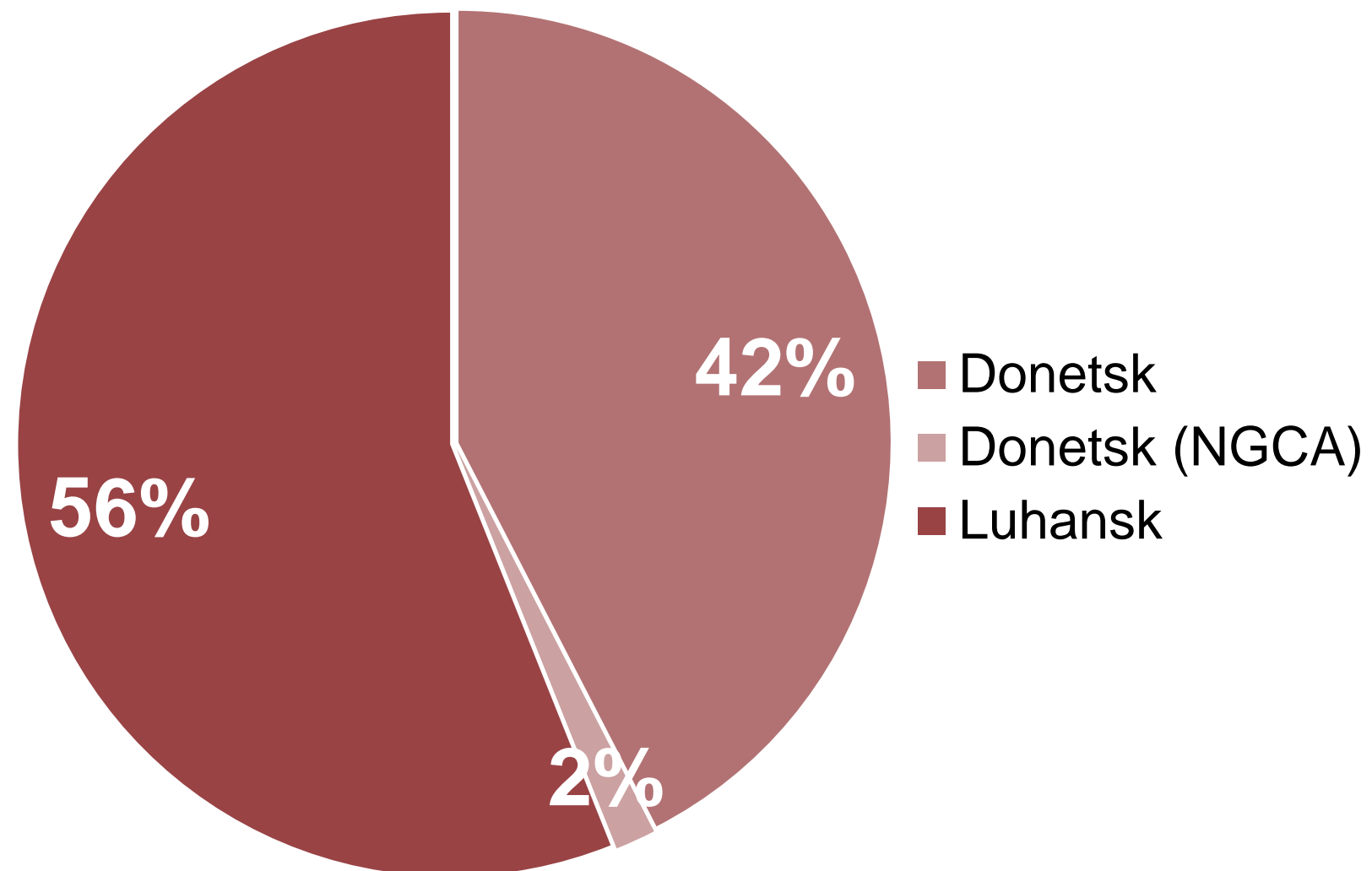

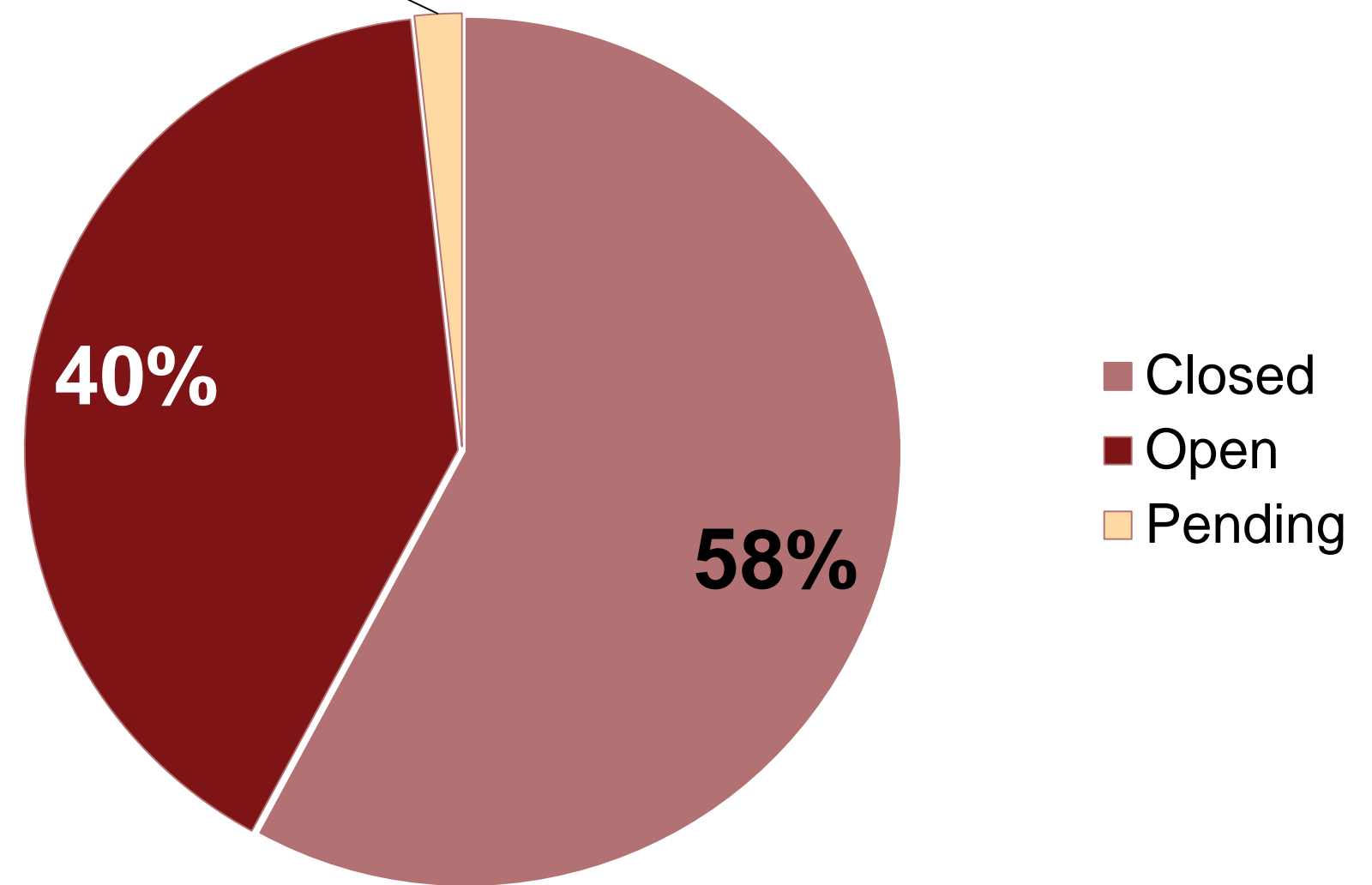
Core functions

Referral Status

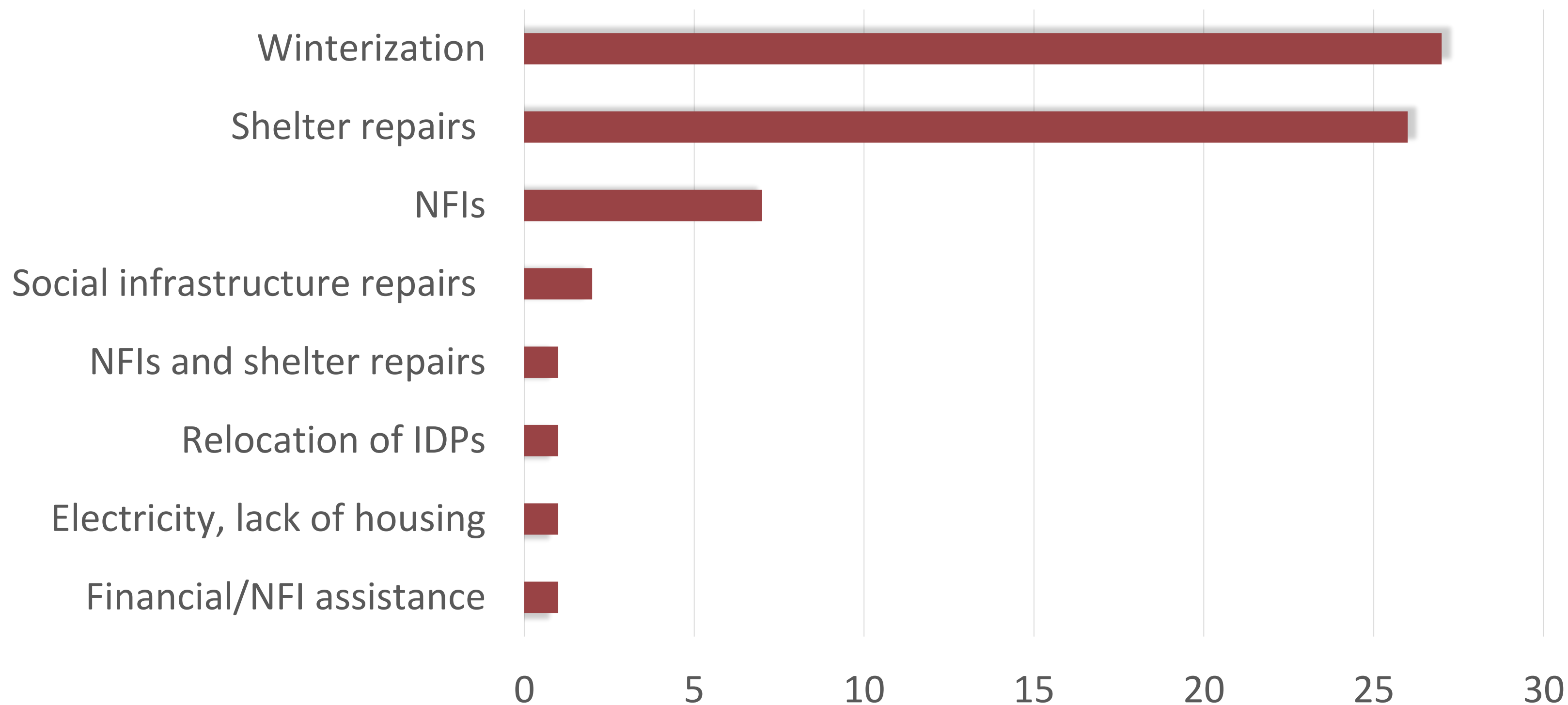


- Average of 1-2 days for Shelter Repairs for organizations to agree to damage assessment (faster response time in warmer months)

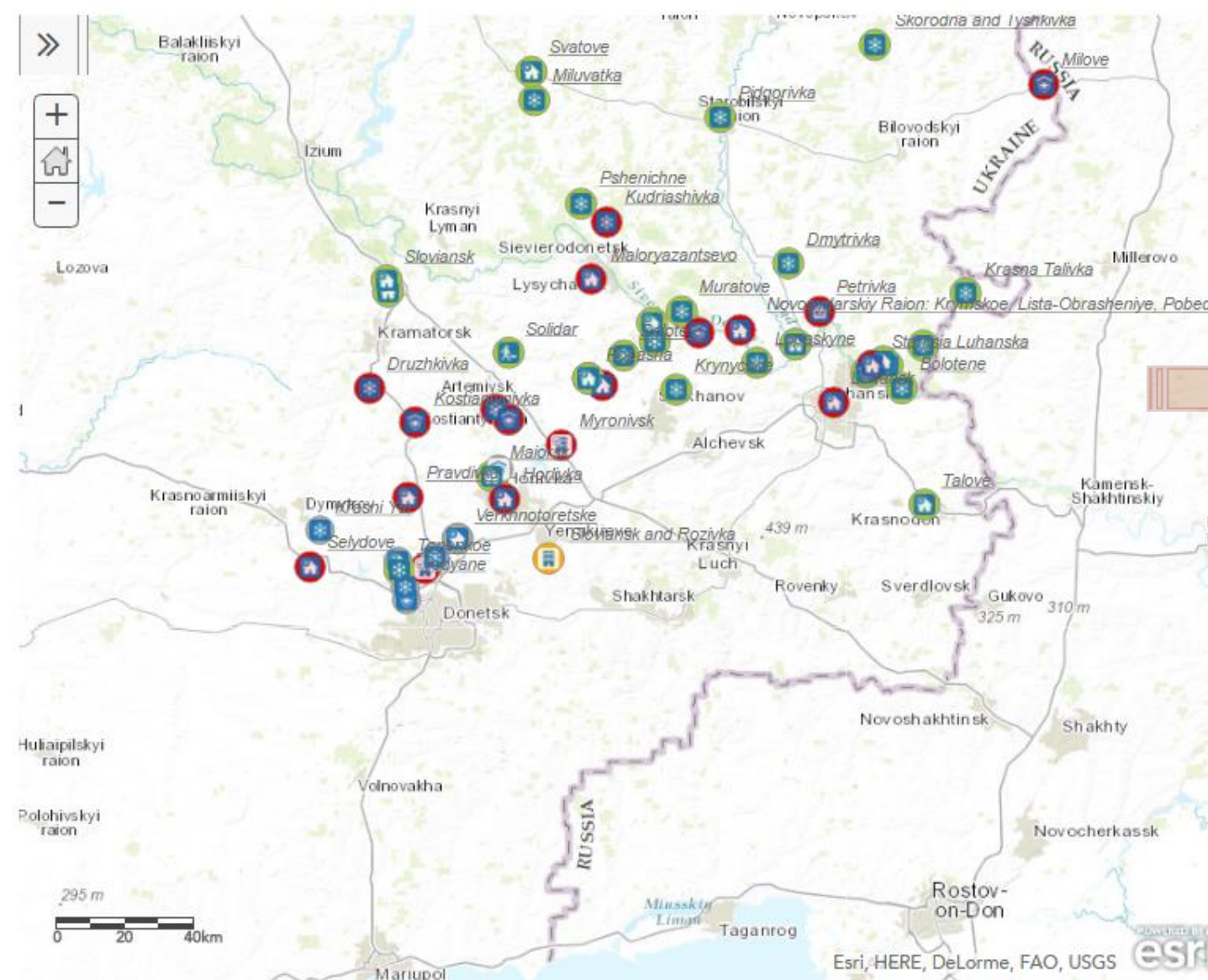

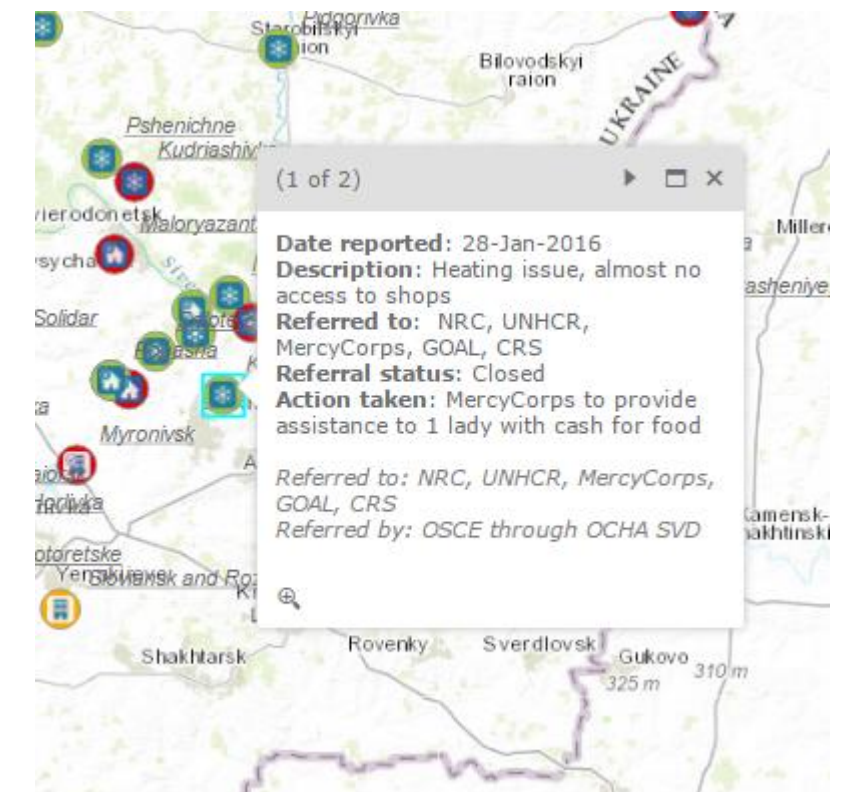

UKRAINE: REFERRAL SYSTEM



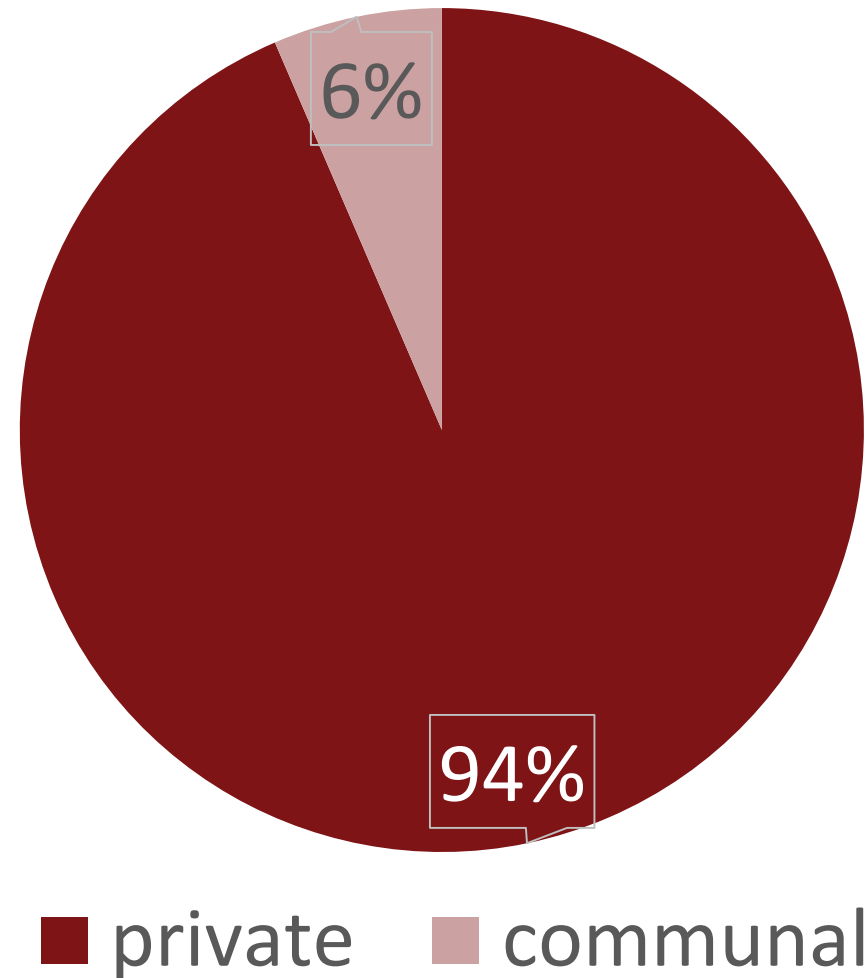

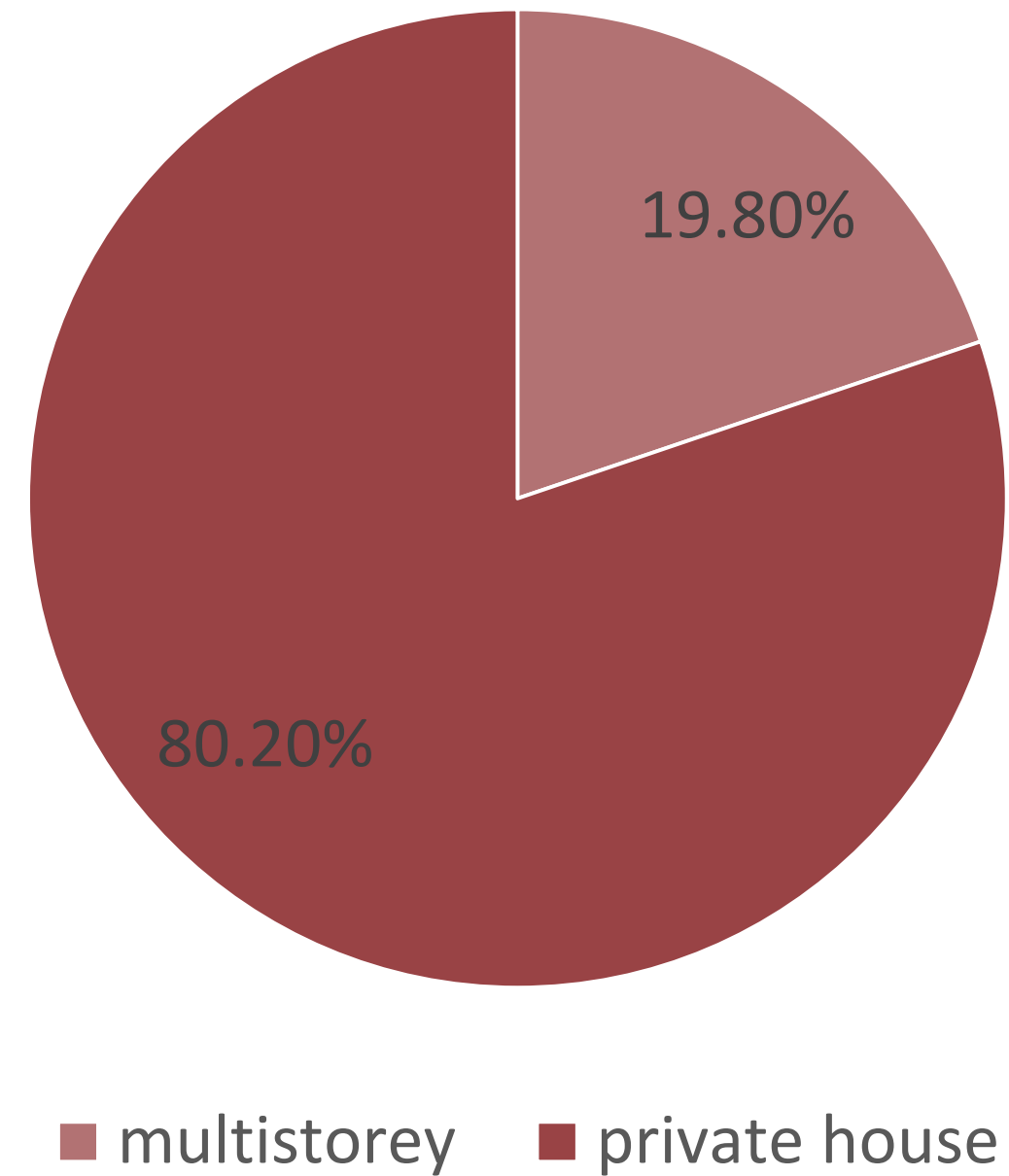

Ownership type

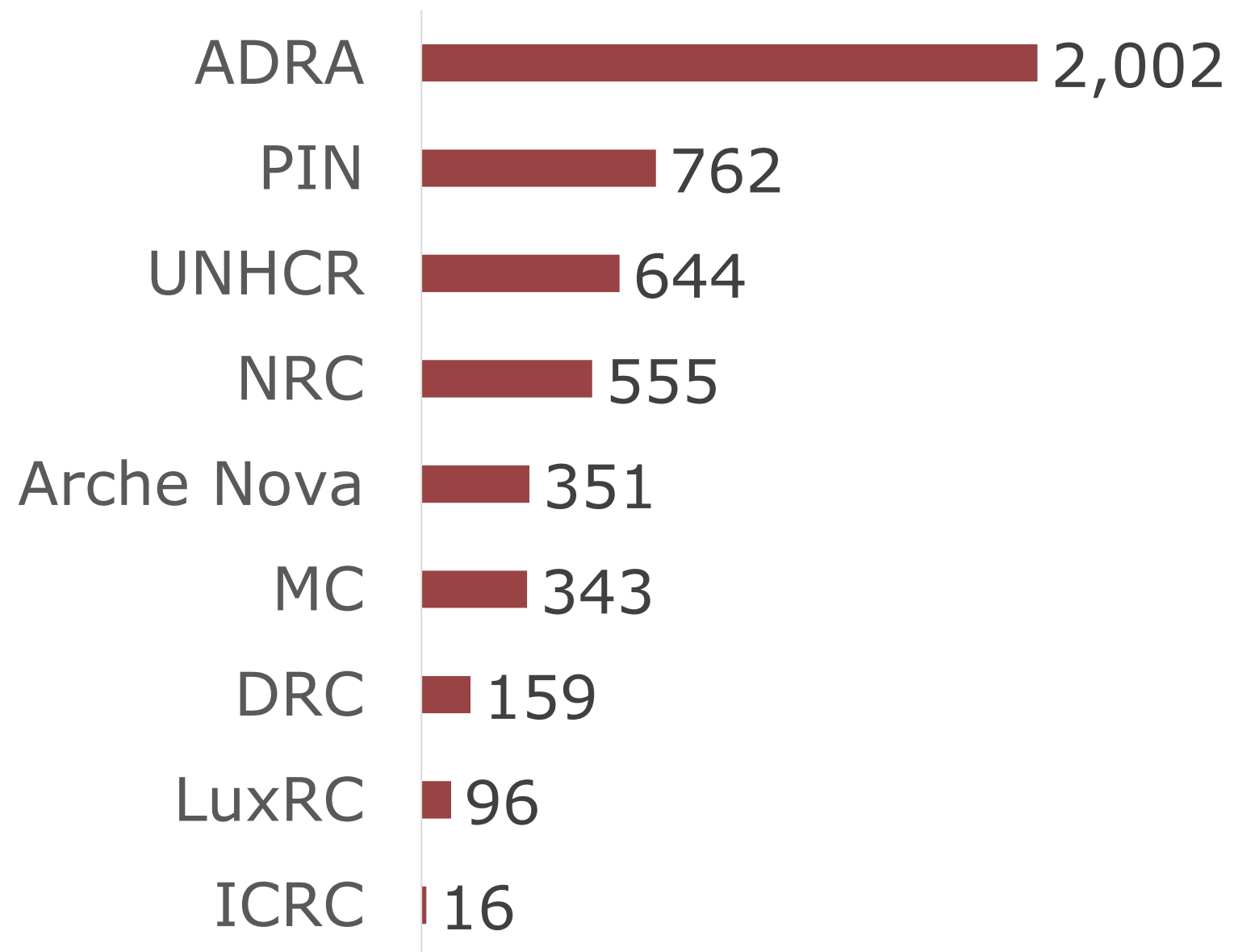


Multistorey vs. private houses

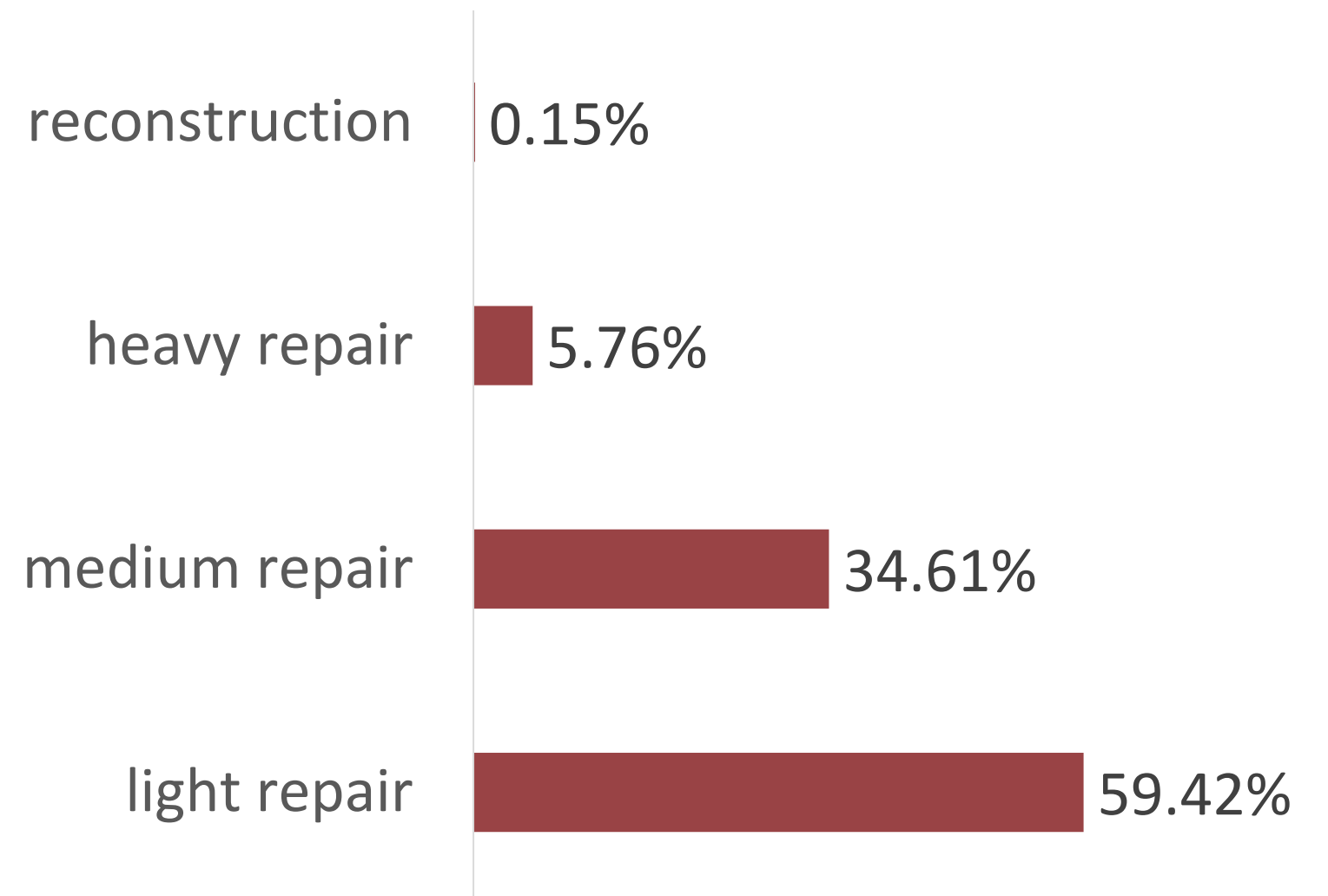

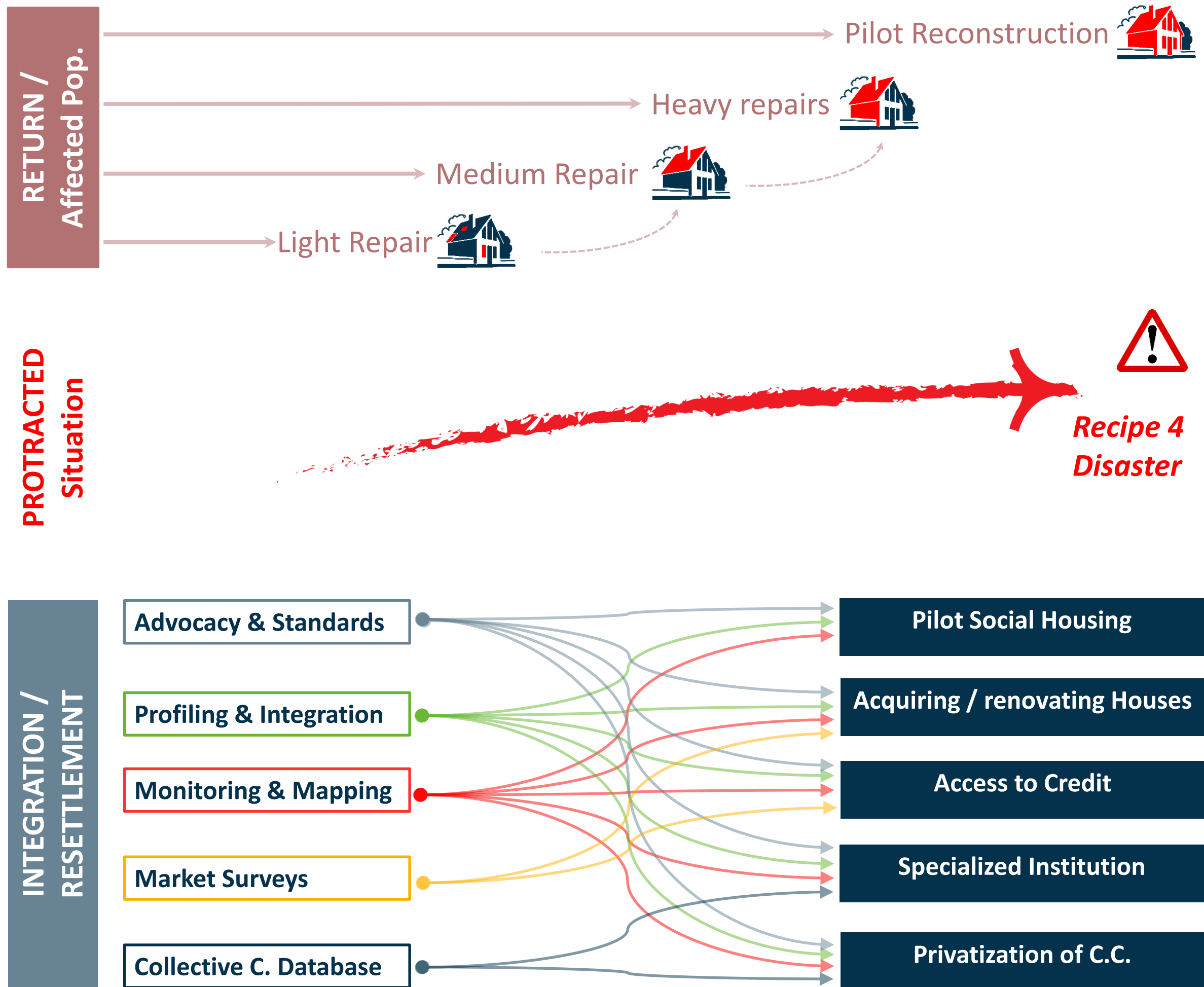

Transitional Plan Walk Through

- Shelter Cluster works to promote **additional capacity for response for durable shelter solutions for permanent stay** of internally displaced persons and conflict affected populations through emergency assistance, transitional solutions, and the facilitation of longer-term durable shelter solutions **until** the minimum criteria for deactivation are met:
- *“The humanitarian situation improves, significantly reducing humanitarian needs and therefore the associated response and coordination gaps.*
- *National structures acquire sufficient capacity to coordinate and meet residual humanitarian needs in line with humanitarian principles”*

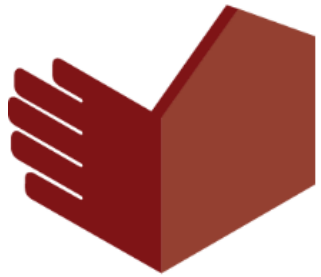

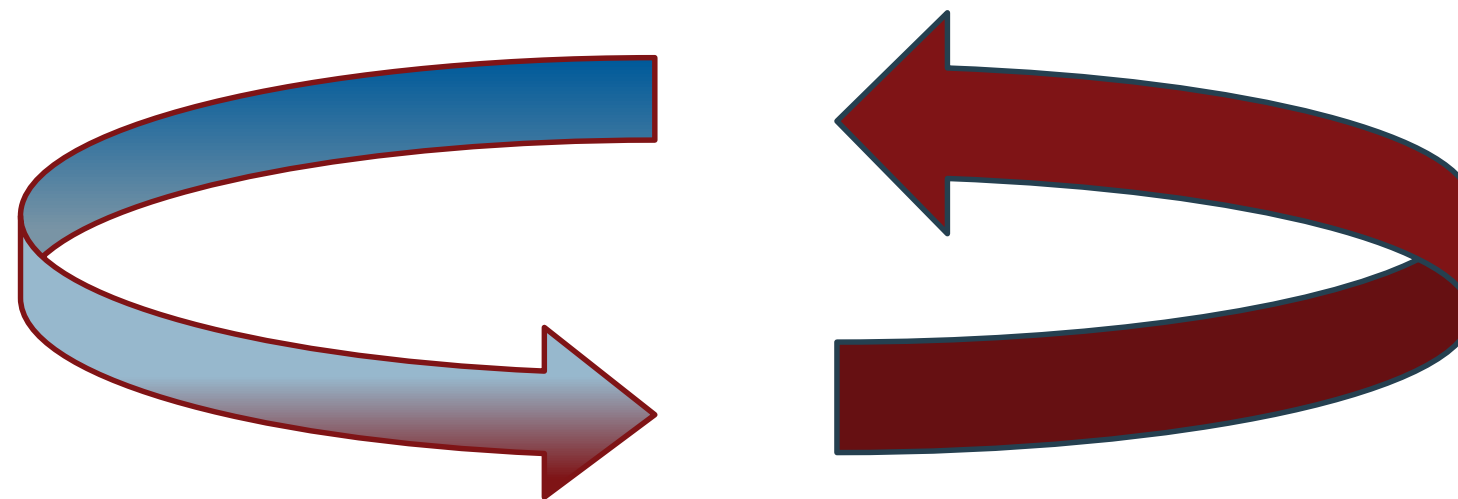
