freedom	of movement. The response will be based on where they decide

there are	no existing funds allocated for the CP. This will require support
from the	authorities, namely MOPIC approval on reprogramming of

- Agreement was reached on how to collaborate with neighboring Governorates. The ExU in Al Hudaydah has indicated acceptance of coordinating with neighboring Governorate in order to set up transit sites. Yet, work will only commence once a there is a trigger to the CP.
- Access matters were also cleared. The ExU in Al Hudaydah has further indicated willingness to facilitate work of the humanitarian actors.

#### d. Protection

 All CP related matters were agreed upon although more discussions are required on TFPM

### e. Logistics

- Ready to support local and international NGOs operating under the Clusters warehousing and transportation services free of charge.
- Cluster to advocate the continued use of Al Hudaydah port.

#### f. Nutrition

 Three matters were highlighted: need of supplies, quality of response and data collection and sharing.

#### g. OCHA

- Actors will need to improve consultation with local authorities.
- Each Cluster will review respective section of CP in order to improve plan.
- Actors will need to improve current response in order to be better prepared for the implementation of the CP.

#### 3. Closing statement by Governor

- a. \With the Holy month of Ramadan around the corner the needs will most likely increase.
- b. Still hopeful that current response will improve in order to be able to meet the needs of the people.
- c. Important the civilian nature of the port is respected and maintained open.
