Demolition response Jan-Nov 2015

Stop Working Orders (SWO):	420	of which 236 are residential (as of 22 Oct)
Demolition Orders (DO):	164	of which 128 are residential (as of 22 Oct)
Actual Demolitions:	495	of which 162 are residential affecting 2,269 individuals, including 946 children
Donor funded structures:	89	of which 52 are residential

166 households assisted with shelter – there are **no gaps** in the demolition shelter response

Housing/Shelter Vulnerability in Area C

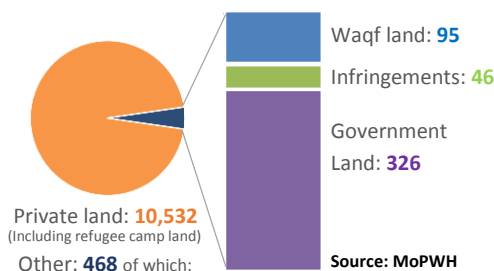
91 shelters have been upgraded in 2015, changing the status of **4** communities from **poor** to **good**. **103** communities with shelters in poor conditions require assistance to upgrade.

Land ownership status of IDPs with Totally Destroyed housing units



1,255 families have returned home after rehabilitation of their severely damaged home.

Winterization and preparedness

Over **400** IDP families living in caravans and **1,000** families living in substandard or damaged homes are being targeted with winterization assistance and NFI support is being prepared for the most vulnerable **1,000** families living in makeshift shelters or tents.

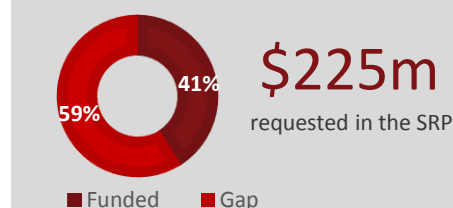

GRM update

In October 2015, aggregates were removed from the list of dual-use materials and started to enter Gaza under the private sector.

As of 30th November, **127,141** individuals (97%) participating in the Shelter Stream who require ABC materials for shelter repairs have been cleared to purchase materials. Of these, **74%** (96,637) have procured full or partial quantities of their allocated material, representing **88%** of allocated construction materials. Of the 6,219 participants in the Residential Stream, **2,672** applications are for the reconstruction of a totally destroyed residential unit, while **3,548** are for construction of a new residential unit. **35%** of allocated construction material in the Residential Stream has been fully or partially procured.
