

NEED ANALYSIS

- According to the Multi-Sectoral Needs Assessment, an estimated 5.7 million people are still in need of shelter repair, assistance and emergency shelter.
- While individual shelter repair is ongoing in communities across the country, large scale damage is still reported in urban centres including East Ghouta, Zabadani, Daryaa, Aleppo, Dar'a and Quenitra.
- Out of 167 shelter repair projects, 37 have been approved for implementation.

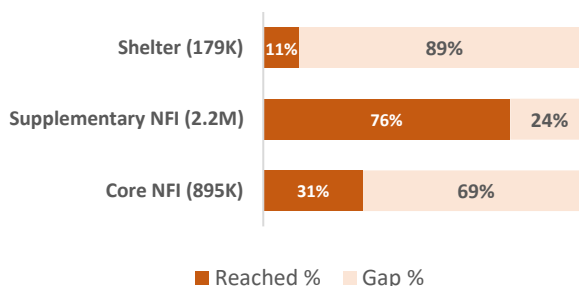
RESPONSE

- In Homs, 5 collective centres were upgraded for families returning from Rukban and can host 500 families.
- Since January, 146,000 people have been reached with newly repaired infrastructure.
- Since January, 41,623 individuals benefited from installation of new tents in 5 camps in the Northeast, including 30,000 arrivals to Al-Hol camp.

GAPS / CHALLENGES

- Diminishing coping capacities of both the IDPs and host communities as well as limited financial resources of government and sector partners are leading to an increase in shelter needs.
- Loss of occupancy documents can made it difficult for some to access shelter support or assistance.
- Opportunities for systematic field-based data collection remain limited due to access restrictions, resulting in incomplete needs analysis in some areas.

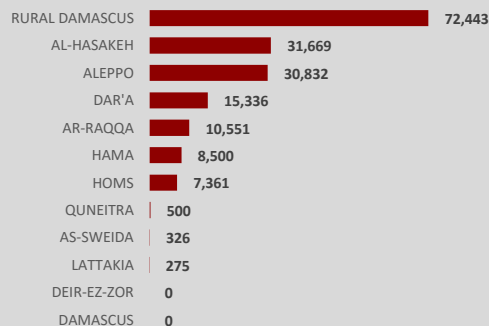

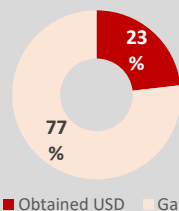

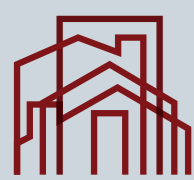

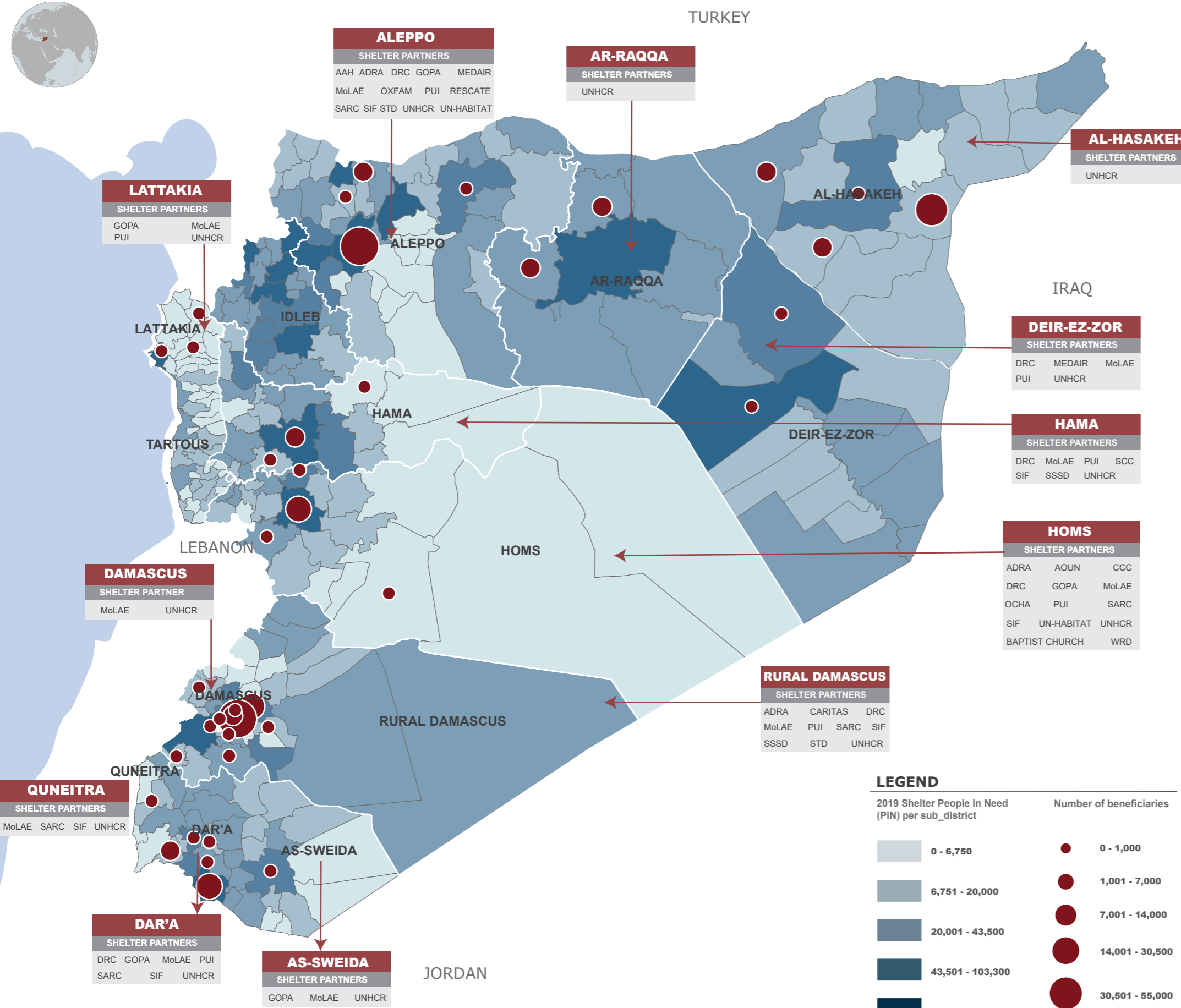

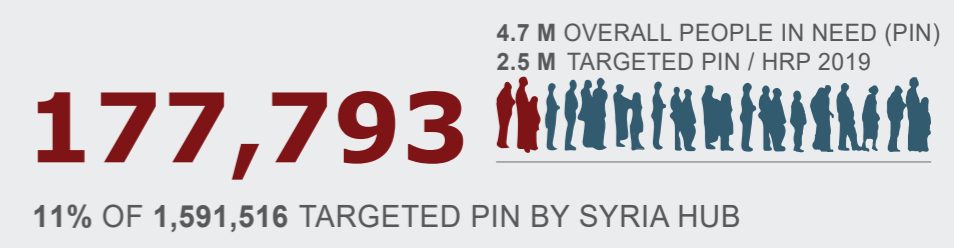


SYRIA: SHELTER SECTOR RESPONSE SNAPSHOT

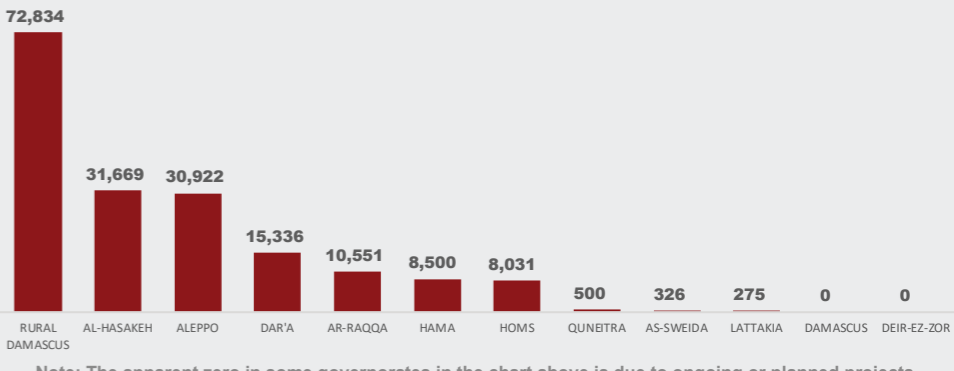

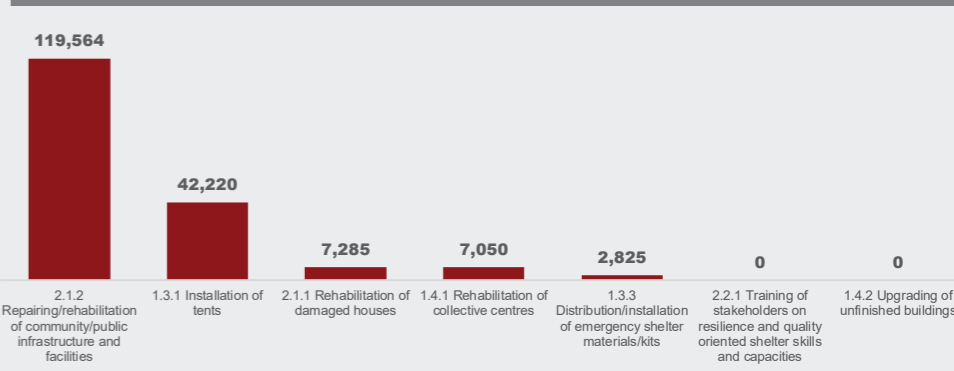
TOTAL BENEFICIARIES COVERED



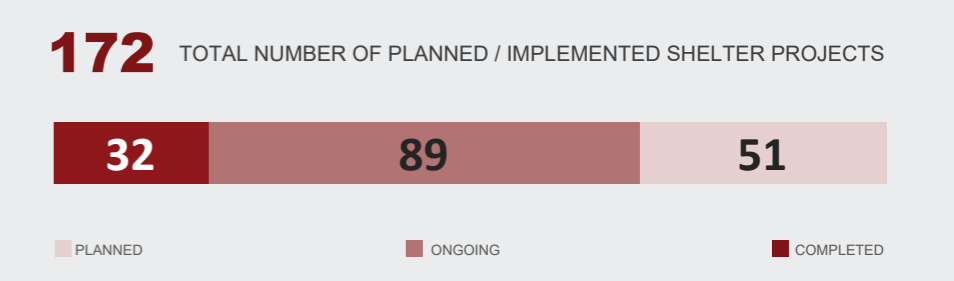
BENEFICIARIES COVERED PER GOVERNORATE
