1. Background

Shelter cluster in Bangladesh officially activated in 2012. However it has been working since cyclone Sidr in 2007. Bangladesh Shelter cluster is actively working with government, INGO, UN agencies, RCRC movement and NGO to make an effective shelter response both in emergency and recovery phase. On the other hand during the preparedness phase Bangladesh shelter cluster has a role in updating information on contingency stocks, assessing organizational capacities in shelter response and supporting development of Bangladesh Shelter standards and guidelines.

In order to enhance shelter cluster coordination mechanism, Bangladesh Shelter cluster have taken initiative to organize a shelter cluster workshop in Bangladesh with the support from IFRC Global shelter cluster. The workshop will take place from 27th to 28th July 2015 in Dhaka.
