






It is important that households accurately report the level of damage sustained in Cyclone Winston in order to receive the correct amount of funds on the electronic cards. Below, please find examples of damaged homes and the level of assistance that they are eligible to receive.

Homes that have Partial Roofing Damage will receive \$1500







Homes that have Complete Roofing Damage will receive \$3000







Homes that are fully destroyed will receive \$7000







Anyone found to have provided false information to Government in the registration process will be fined up to \$20,000 and can face prison sentences of up to 10 years. Spot checks will be conducted by the Ministry of Finance audit teams to verify claims and ensure that benefits are only received by Fijians that meet the criteria for the Help for Homes initiative.

## Standardization of emergency shelter/NFI relief package

- Currently there is no standard emergency shelter package.
- Has been highlighted by shelter cluster partners as an opportunity for improvement
- Shelter Cluster lead recommends development of standard package in order to enhance effectiveness, and timeliness of response and to ensure all affected population receive appropriate level of assistance in accordance with minimum standards.
- Early recovery considered from day one.
