



NEEDS ANALYSIS

- IDPs in Protection of Civilian (PoC) areas of UN peacekeeping bases urgently require shelter reinforcements ahead of the rainy season. Approximately half of the shelters previously constructed in the Malakal PoC site require immediate replacement after internal fighting set fire to the shelters of 20,000 people in mid-February.
- 1.6 million people in field locations continue to be unable to provide basic shelter and household items for themselves due to: continued displacement, national and local conflict, deteriorating markets, rapid inflation, failed harvests, and extreme weather.

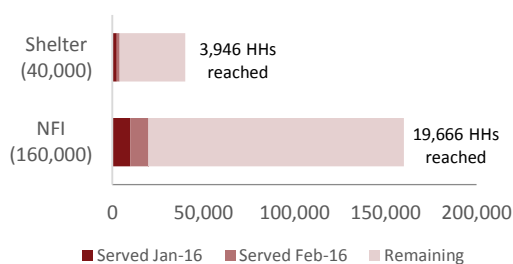
RESPONSE

- In 2016, the Cluster has reached 98,330 people with NFI and 19,730 with shelter assistance;
- There are currently 10 locations in the country where ongoing assessments and distributions are serving returning IDPs, newly displaced communities and residents of PoC sites;
- In the hardest to reach areas where insecurity prevents humanitarian access, such as Western Equatoria, the Cluster is providing the rapid delivery of multi-sectoral 'survival kits' that contain key life-saving items from Nutrition, WASH, FSL and NFI Clusters.

GAPS / CHALLENGES

- Limited financial, logistical and human resources relative to South Sudan's extremely high needs and difficult operating environment continue to limit the amount of assistance provided;
- Humanitarian access in some areas where needs are critical continues to be either denied or unfeasible due to conflict, flooding and the South Sudan's lack of road and transport infrastructure.

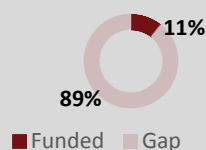
