



## HIGHLIGHTS

- From September to December 2019 the Cluster has conducted field missions to Zulia, Bolívar, Táchira, Amazonas, Apure, Carabobo, and Sucre to identify needs and support the 2020 Humanitarian Needs Overview (HNO) data collection.
- A Technical Assessment Working Group on kits identified three basic kits: people in mobility with specific needs (both for individuals and families), and a domestic/habitat kit (families).
- Using a KoBoToolbox survey the Cluster analysed the operational and implementation capacity of its members.
- The Cluster is developing the logframe for next year activities and working on the updated 3W/4W platform.
- The Cluster developed a map of temporary shelter for people in mobility to facilitate planning and coordination among the Shelter Cluster members who expressed interest in implementing activities in those locations.
- Workshops on the use of renewable energy and water resources were introduced and will be conducted through January 2020.

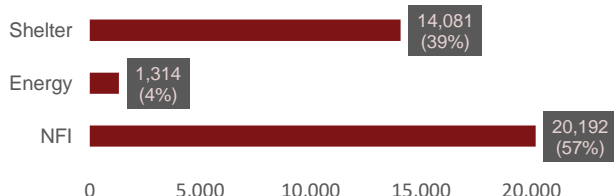
## CLUSTER PRIORITIES

- Keep on working on the 2020 HNO, the calculation of the People in Need (PiN), and the identification of activities for the 2020 Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP).
- Finalise the NFI catalog.
- Strengthen the sub-national presence in remote and prioritised field locations.

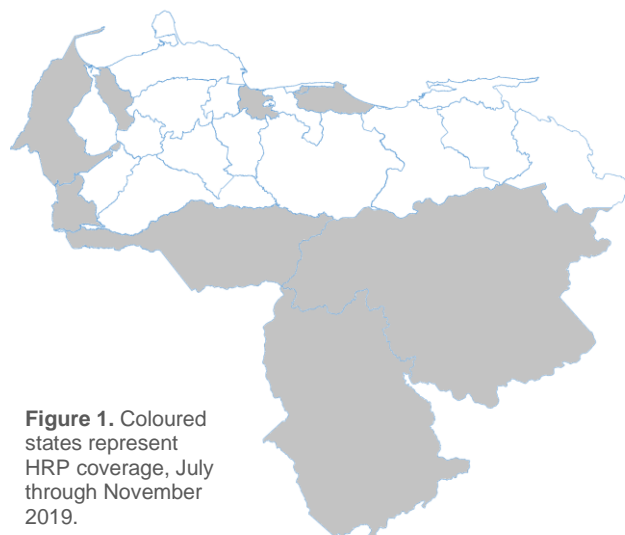
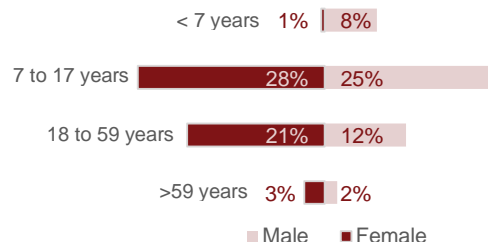
## GAPS / CHALLENGES

- The activities implemented by the cluster members remain focused on NFIs, however the capacity to implement shelter-specific activities has improved.
- There are only few cluster members that have conducted assessments at household level. Still, there is a need on conducting a shelter-specific assessment using quantitative data sources.
- Despite the national cluster members are growing in number, they are still small in scale and capacity, thus limiting the capacity to implement activities in remote field locations.

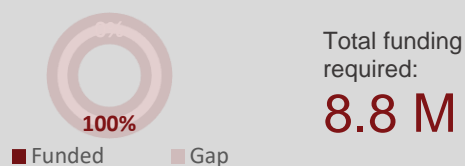
